
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES TO
REPORT ON THE FUEL EFFICIENCY OF VEHICLES IN EACH EXECUTIVE
AGENCY'S FLEET.

1 WHEREAS, eighty per cent of the energy resources used in
2 Hawaii and almost all of the fuel used by motor vehicles in
3 Hawaii are imported from other countries or the mainland United
4 States; and

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6 WHEREAS, fuel-efficient vehicles conserve fuel resources
7 and make the State less dependent on imported oil and motor
8 vehicle fuels; and

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10 WHEREAS, fuel-efficient vehicles also emit less pollution
11 and carbon emissions, thus helping to preserve Hawaii's natural
12 environment; and

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14 WHEREAS, fuel costs make a up a significant portion of the
15 motor vehicle fleet budgets of state government agencies, and
16 the use of more fuel-efficient vehicles would result in savings
17 to those agencies; and

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19 WHEREAS, in addition to the budgetary benefits of fuel
20 efficiency, state departments can improve the environment and
21 reduce Hawaii's dependence on imported oil by increasing fuel
22 efficiency in their vehicle fleets; and now, therefore,

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24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
25 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
26 of 2010, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
27 Accounting and General Services is requested to provide a report
28 to the Legislature on the motor vehicle fleets of each executive
29 agency under its administration containing information on:

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31 (1) Types of vehicles;

- 2 (2) Fuel efficiency of each type of vehicle;
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- 4 (3) Progress made in improving the fuel efficiency of the
- 5 fleet; and
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- 7 (4) Each agency's plans to promote further improvement in
- 8 fuel efficiency; and
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10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting
 11 and General Services is requested to report its findings to the
 12 Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 13 the Regular Session of 2011; and

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 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
 16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Comptroller.
