## HOUSE RESOLUTION

HONORING THE JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF HAWAII 2010 HAWAII BUSINESS  
HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES.

1           WHEREAS, since 1990, the JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF HAWAII  
2 BUSINESS HALL OF FAME has honored the state's most distinguished  
3 business leaders for their outstanding contributions to free  
4 enterprise and the promise of a stronger society; and

6           WHEREAS, JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF HAWAII, INC. was founded in  
7 1957 to educate and inspire young people to appreciate business  
8 and economics in order that they can improve their lives and  
9 their communities; and  
10

11           WHEREAS, JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF HAWAII, INC. has created a  
12 working partnership among business, military, and education  
13 communities with the mission of ensuring that Hawaii's children  
14 will have the opportunity to learn about the free-enterprise  
15 system; and

17           WHEREAS, through nearly 500 offices around the world,  
18 Junior Achievement reaches over nine million students a year in  
19 inner cities, suburbs, and rural areas; and

21           WHEREAS, the purpose of the JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT HAWAII  
22 BUSINESS HALL OF FAME is to recognize business leaders who,  
23 through their life-long entrepreneurial and civic activities  
24 have made enduring contributions to the local economy through  
25 their work, and are figures of inspiration for Hawaii's youth;

28           WHEREAS, as a former Waikiki beach boy, ANTHONY R. GUERRERO  
29 has, over a 42 year banking career, skillfully led his teams  
30 through numerous expansions of First Hawaiian Bank leading to  
31 his position as Vice Chairman and Group Manager overseeing  
32 management of 63 bank branches in Hawaii, Guam and Saipan; and

2 WHEREAS, as an excellent role model for Hawaii's youth,  
3 ANTHONY R. GUERRERO, sets a perfect example for Hawaii's youth  
4 on how hard work and dedication can lead to limitless  
5 possibilities in the business world ; and

7 WHEREAS, with over 20 years in the practice of  
8 ophthalmology, DR. TYRIE JENKINS is recognized as one of the  
9 premier laser eye surgeons and business leaders in Hawaii; and

11 WHEREAS, DR. TYRIE JENKINS leads the way in community  
12 service such as providing free eye exams for 30 Cambodian  
13 orphans visiting Hawaii, leading a medical mission from Hawaii  
14 to the Western Samoa island of Sawaii, serving on a medical  
15 mission to Zhong Shan, China, and serving as a mentor with the  
16 Girl Scouts of Hawaii; and

18 WHEREAS, growing up and helping in his grandparents' store,  
19 BARRY K. TANIGUCHI learned the business from the ground up, and  
20 after attending college and working for outside firms as an  
21 accountant and CPA, was asked to come home to take the  
22 leadership of the family business; and

24 WHEREAS, BARRY K. TANIGUCHI gives back to the Big Island  
25 community ten-fold by serving on numerous civic organizations  
26 including serving on trade associations, professional  
27 organizations such as the Hawaii and American Society of CPAs,  
28 cultural associations, and is also actively involved with  
29 serving the Hawaii Community College and the University of  
30 Hawaii at Hilo; and

32 WHEREAS, on Friday, March 12, 2010, ANTHONY GUERRERO of  
33 First Hawaiian Bank, TYRIE JENKINS, M.D. of Tyrie Jenkins, M.D.  
34 Eye Care, and BARRY K. TANIGUCHI of the KTA Superstores will be  
35 inducted into the HAWAII BUSINESS HALL OF FAME for 2010; and

37 WHEREAS, these honorees join a distinguished group of 70  
38 men and women who have been included into the HAWAII BUSINESS  
39 HALL OF FAME since its inception; now, therefore,
