
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 356D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3 " (a) There is created a board of directors consisting of
4 eleven members, of whom nine shall be public members appointed
5 by the governor as provided in section 26-34. Public members
6 shall be appointed from each of the counties of Honolulu,
7 Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai. At least [~~one~~] two public [~~member~~]
8 members shall be [~~a person~~] persons who [~~is~~] are each either
9 directly assisted or formerly assisted by the authority under
10 the federal low-rent public housing or federal section 8 tenant-
11 based housing assistance payments program while serving on the
12 board. One public member shall be an advocate for low-income or
13 homeless persons. One public member shall be a person with a
14 disability or an advocate for persons with disabilities. The
15 public members of the board shall serve four-year staggered
16 terms; provided that the initial appointments shall be as
17 follows: four members shall be appointed for four years; three
18 members shall be appointed for three years; and two members



1 shall be appointed for two years. The director of human
2 services, or a designated representative, and a representative
3 of the governor's office, shall be ex officio voting members.
4 The authority shall be headed by the board."

5 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Hawaii Public Housing Authority; Board of Directors; Number of Resident Public Members

Description:

Increases from one to two the minimum number of members on the board of directors of the Hawaii public housing authority (HPHA) who are directly assisted by HPHA under the federal low-rent public housing or federal section 8 tenant-based housing assistance payments program and expands that requirement to also include those who have been formerly assisted by HPHA under those federal programs.
