
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTHCARE CLAIMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established a health care claims
2 uniform reporting and evaluation task force within the
3 department of commerce and consumer affairs for administrative
4 purposes, to consist of eleven members as follows:

5 (1) Four representatives from insurers, mutual benefit
6 societies, fraternal benefit societies, and health
7 maintenance organizations with the largest market
8 shares for health insurance in Hawaii, to be appointed
9 by the insurance commissioner;

10 (2) The insurance commissioner or the commissioner's
11 designee;

12 (3) The director of commerce and consumer affairs or the
13 director's designee;

14 (4) One representative from Hawaii Medical Association;

15 (5) One representative from Healthcare Association of
16 Hawaii;

17 (6) Two physicians licensed and practicing in the state;

18 and



1 (7) A representative from the John A. Burns school of
2 medicine of the University of Hawaii.

3 (b) The members of the health care claims uniform
4 reporting and evaluation task force shall elect a chairperson
5 from among its membership.

6 (c) The health care claims uniform reporting and
7 evaluation task force shall undertake a study to:

8 (1) Develop policies and procedures necessary to establish
9 a health care claims uniform reporting and evaluation
10 system and to ensure that the system is consistent
11 with national claims reporting and evaluation
12 standards; and

13 (2) Standardize third-party processing and payment of
14 prescription drug claims by pharmacy benefit managers.

15 (d) Members of the health care claims uniform reporting
16 and evaluation task force shall serve without compensation and
17 shall not be reimbursed for expenses.

18 (e) The health care claims uniform reporting and
19 evaluation task force shall submit a report of its findings and
20 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
21 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
22 the regular session of 2011.



1 (f) The health care claims uniform reporting and
2 evaluation task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2011.

3 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.



Report Title:

Hawaii Health Care Claims Uniform Reporting and Evaluation System; Task Force

Description:

Establishes a health care claims uniform reporting and evaluation task force to develop necessary policies and procedures to establish a health care claims uniform reporting and evaluation system, and to standardize third-party processing and payment of prescription drug claims. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB2529 HD2)

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
