
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LEGACY LAND CONSERVATION COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 173A-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
3 and to read as follows:

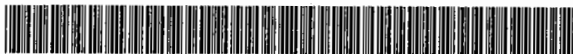
4 "Commission" means the legacy land conservation
5 commission."

6 SECTION 2. Section 173A-2.4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

8 "(a) There is established within the department of land
9 and natural resources a legacy land conservation commission.

10 The commission shall consist of nine members, with at least one
11 member from each of the counties, who shall be appointed in the
12 manner and serve for the term set forth in section 26-34 as
13 follows:

14 (1) Four of the members of the commission shall be persons
15 possessing scientific qualifications as evidenced by
16 an academic degree in wildlife or marine biology,
17 botany, forestry, ecology, resource management,
18 biogeography, zoology, or geology;



- 1 (2) One member shall be a person possessing membership in
- 2 an environmental organization organized in the State;
- 3 (3) One member shall be a person possessing membership in
- 4 a land conservation organization organized in the
- 5 State;
- 6 (4) One member shall be a person possessing membership in
- 7 a statewide agricultural association; and
- 8 (5) One member shall be a person knowledgeable about
- 9 native Hawaiian culture.

10 The chairperson of the natural area reserves system commission,
11 or the chairperson's designated representative from the natural
12 area reserves system commission, shall serve as an ex officio
13 voting member [~~and the chairperson of the commission~~]. The
14 members of the commission shall elect the chairperson of the
15 commission. The members of the commission shall receive no
16 compensation for their services on the commission but shall be
17 entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses, including
18 travel expenses, incurred in the discharge of their duties."

19 SECTION 3. Section 173A-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended to read as follows:

2 conservation commission. The responsibilities of the commission
3 shall include, but not be limited to:

4 (1) Advising the department and the board on any proposal,
5 public or private, for the acquisition of any interest
6 or rights in land having value as a resource to the
7 State;

8 (2) Advising the department and the board on any requests
9 for grants from the fund to a qualifying state or
10 county agency or nonprofit land conservation
11 organization for the preservation of lands having
12 value as a resource to the State;

13 (3) Advising the department and the board on any requests
14 for grants from the fund to a qualifying state or
15 county agency or nonprofit land conservation
16 organization for the protection of the environment and
17 lands from harmful invasive species infestations and
18 any costs related to harmful invasive species
19 eradication efforts throughout the State;

20 ~~(3)~~ (4) Recommending to the board the acquisition of
21 interests or rights in certain lands having value as a
22 resource to the State; and



1 ~~[(4)]~~ (5) Reviewing and adopting rules relating to the
2 criteria it applies in advising the department and the
3 board and making recommendations to the board
4 regarding land acquisitions and grants made pursuant
5 to this chapter."

6 SECTION 4. Section 173A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:

8 "(h) The fund shall be used for:

- 9 (1) The acquisition of interests or rights in land having
10 value as a resource to the State, whether in fee title
11 or through the establishment of permanent conservation
12 easements under chapter 198 or agricultural easements;
- 13 (2) The payment of any debt service on state financial
14 instruments relating to the acquisition of interests
15 or rights in land having value as a resource to the
16 State;
- 17 (3) Annual administration costs for the fund, not to
18 exceed five per cent of annual fund revenues of the
19 previous year~~[(+; and)]~~;
- 20 (4) Costs related to the operation, maintenance, and
21 management of lands acquired by way of this fund that
22 are necessary to protect, maintain, or restore



1 resources at risk on these lands, or that provide for
2 greater public access and enjoyment of these lands;
3 provided that the costs related to the operation,
4 maintenance, and management of lands acquired by way
5 of this fund do not exceed five per cent of annual
6 fund revenues of the previous year[-]; and

7 (5) Costs related to the control and eradication of
8 harmful invasive species infestations throughout the
9 State and related efforts of the invasive species
10 council, established pursuant to section 194-2."

11 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Legacy Land Conservation Commission; Invasive Species

Description:

Authorizes the chairperson of the natural area reserves system commission to designate a representative from the natural area reserves system commission to serve on the legacy land conservation commission; authorizes the members of the legacy land conservation commission to elect their own chairperson; expands the responsibilities of the legacy land commission to include the protection of lands and the environment from harmful invasive species infestations and the costs related to infestation eradication; permits the land conservation fund to pay grants to state and county agencies for harmful invasive species prevention and eradication efforts. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
