SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING APRIL AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS AND PREVENTION
MONTH.

1 WHEREAS, sexual assault affects women, men, and children of
2 all racial, social, religious, age, ethnic, and economic groups
3 in the United States; and

4
5 WHEREAS, on average, one person is sexually assaulted in
6 the United States every two and a half minutes; and

7
8 WHEREAS, one in six women and one in 33 men have been the
9 victim of rape or attempted rape; and

10
11 WHEREAS, the Department of Defense received 2,688 reports
12 of sexual assault involving members of the Armed Forces in
13 fiscal year 2007; and

14
15 WHEREAS, the rate of reported forcible rape, including
16 assaults and attempts to commit rape by force in the State of
17 Hawaii increased 3.9 percent from 2006 to 2007; and

18
19 WHEREAS, only 41 percent of sexual assault victims pursue
20 prosecution by reporting their attacks to law enforcement
21 agencies; and

23 WHEREAS, sexual assault survivors suffer emotional scars
24 long after the physical scars have healed; and

26 WHEREAS, prevention education programs carried out by rape
27 crisis and women's health centers have the potential to reduce
28 the prevalence of sexual assault in their communities; now,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the
3 House of Representatives concurring, that April is recognized as
4 "Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month"; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the month of April will provide
7 a special opportunity to educate the people of Hawaii about
8 sexual violence and to encourage the prevention of sexual
9 assault, the improved treatment of its survivors, and the
10 prosecution of its perpetrators; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that community organizations and
13 private sector supporters should be recognized and applauded for
14 their work in promoting awareness about sexual assault, and
15 providing information and treatment to its survivors; and
16

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature encourages
18 community organizations, businesses in the private sector,
19 colleges and universities, and the media to promote, through
20 "Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month," awareness of
21 sexual violence and strategies to decrease the incidence of
22 sexual assault; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human
26 Services and Executive Director of the Hawaii State Coalition
27 Against Domestic Violence.
