begs leave to report as follows:


Your Committee received testimony in support of this nomination from the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Hawaii Automobile Dealers Association, and three private citizens. A personal statement and resume were received from the nominee. Written testimony presented to the Committee may be reviewed on the Legislature's website.

Upon review of the testimony, your Committee finds that the nominee's professional experience, commitment to public service, and proven leadership on the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board qualify him for reappointment as an industry member to the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board. Your Committee notes that the nominee is President and General Manager of BMW of Honolulu, with over forty years experience in the automotive industry, a background which brings a breadth of knowledge to his work on the Board.
