RELATING TO THE LONG TERM CARE COMMISSION.
Requires the long term care commission to review the feasibility of establishing a long term care fund to assist residents who would otherwise not qualify for any government or private long term care insurance program. Requires the Commission to recommend appropriate funding mechanisms. Requires conclusions and recommendations of the review to be included in the commission's final report to the legislature on September 30, 2010. (HB2939 HD1)

Repeals the sunset provisions with respect to general excise tax exemptions for condominium submanagers, suboperators, and timeshare associations. Specifies that the \$400,000 cap is based on the taxable amount due and not the gross receipts. (HB2783 HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
