<u>HB 2136</u> <u>(HSCR408-10)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DISTRIBUTIONS BY NONPROFIT CORPORATIONS. Permits current distributions by nonprofit corporations to its nonprofit members and affiliates, provided that the distributions are in accordance with the distributing nonprofit corporations' purposes and will not jeopardize their liquidity.	CPN
<u>HB 2027, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR22-10)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DISHONORED CHECKS. Clarifies that payees or holders in due course may assess a service charge up to \$30 for a dishonored check. (HB2027 HD1)	CPN
<u>HB 2028</u> <u>(HSCR55-10)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GROUP LIFE INSURANCE. Requires insurance commissioner approval of the issuance of group life insurance policies that cover other than the listed groups. Expands group disability insurance to include groups other than the listed groups.	CPN
<u>HB 2546</u> <u>(HSCR422-10)</u> <u>Testimony</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RESTORATION OF CERTAIN FORFEITED PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSES. Establishes times limits to restore forfeited chiropractic examiner licenses and individual real estate broker and salesperson licenses.	CPN

When faxing, please indicate to which committee the testimony is being submitted and the date and time of the hearing.

Please note: If you submit your written testimony after 4:00 p.m. the day prior to the hearing, please sign-in at the staff table to testify orally. A copy of your testimony may not be available during the hearing but will be posted online for the public after the hearing.
