Status

RELATING TO SEAWATER AIR CONDITIONING.
Allows the sale of cooling from seawater air conditioning district
cooling systems to qualify for state enterprise zone benefits.

<u>HB 2213</u> Status	RELATING TO SURETY BONDING. Provides assistance in securing surety bonding and guarantees to small and emerging contractors who bid on and win federal contracts in Hawaii.	EBM, FIN
<u>HB 1965</u> Status	RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. Requires an archaeological inventory survey prior to the sale or offer of sale of any property in the State.	EBM, WLO, JUD
<u>HB 2185</u> Status	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Moves primary election date to an earlier time. Makes various amendments to absentee ballot laws to comply with federal law.	EBM, JUD, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
