<u>HB 2818</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LIQUOR COMMISSIONS. Requires county liquor commissions to adopt or amend rules regarding conduct of patrons and to define the term "dancing."	EBM, CPC/JUD
<u>HB 2125</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. Requires businesses in the State to collect an offset fee for each plastic disposable checkout bag distributed to customers.	EEP, EBM, FIN
<u>HB 2676</u> <u>(HSCR 133-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE KAHO'OLAWA ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION. Exempts contracts made by the Kaho'olawe island reserve commission for the procurement of food or fuel products from the state procurement code.	HAW, EBM, FIN
<u>HB 2434</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PERMIT, LICENSE, AND APPROVAL APPLICATION PROCESSING. Establishes a maximum time period that an application for permit, license, or approval shall be deemed granted if not acted upon by the designated agency; authorizes each county to contract with a third-party reviewer to streamline the processing of applications; clarifies that previously approved projects that do not impact historic properties are not subject to subsequent reviews by the SHPD.	EBM, WLO
<u>HB 2984</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAX CREDITS. Extends the tax credit for research activities for 1 year.	EBM, FIN
<u>HB 2217</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF PLANNING. Establishes the planning special fund for the operations of the office of planning, including personnel costs.	EBM, FIN



HB 2831 RELATING TO THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF EBM, FIN  
Status HAWAII AUTHORITY.  
Authorizes natural energy laboratory of Hawaii to acquire, hold, and  
sell qualified securities subject to certain conditions. Authorizes  
NELHA to accept donations of money and services.

The following measures were previously heard on **Thursday, February 4, 2010** and are for **DECISION-MAKING ONLY**. **NO PUBLIC** testimony will be accepted.

HB 2057 RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. EBM, FIN  
Status Requires a purchasing agency to hold a pre-bid conference. Requires  
parties that protest a contract award to have attended a pre-bid  
conference.

HB 2058 RELATING TO PUBLIC PROPERTY. EBM, FIN  
Status Amends definition of the term "concession" to remove  
telecommunications operations. Exempts telecommunications  
operations from the Hawaii public procurement code.

HB 2133 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. EBM, FIN  
Status Amends the Hawaii public procurement code to make public contracts  
effective as of the notice of the award. Specifies that the solicitation,  
offer, bid, or proposal and the award notice constitute the entire  
contract. Provides that a subsequent written and executed contract is  
not required.

HB 2283 RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. EBM, FIN  
Status Requires government purchasers to follow ethical principles in matters  
relating to procurement.

HB 2438 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. EBM  
Status Clarifies requirements for adequate public notice of an invitation for  
bids and request for proposals.

HB 2443 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. EBM, FIN  
Status Imposes sixty day period in which to certify contracts after award of  
contract of procurement.

HB 2901 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. EBM, FIN  
Status Establishes special procedures for requests for competitive sealed  
proposals for design-build projects.


