SB 2139, SD2 (SSCR2432) Status	RELATING TO VETERANS. Requires the director of the office of veterans' services to act on behalf of deceased veterans found to be indigent at the time of death and without surviving immediate family members to ensure the burial or cremation and interment of the veteran's remains in a state veterans cemetery. (SD2)	EBM, FIN
SB 2548, SD2 (SSCR2578) Status	RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY. Implements the information technology recommendations of Auditor's Report No. 09-06; establishes within the office of the governor a chief information officer and information technology steering committee to organize, manage, and oversee statewide information technology governance. Creates the shared services technology special fund to be funded by an unspecified percentage of central service fees. Effective 01/01/2099.	EBM, FIN
SB 2831, SD1 (SSCR2502) Status	RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. Makes permanent the requirements for withholding payment to a subcontractor effectuated by Act 175, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009. (SD1)	EBM, FIN
SB 2843, SD2 (SSCR2558) Status	RELATING TO FLAGS. Recognizes and requires the prisoner of war/missing in action flag to be flown with the U.S. and Hawaiian flags on state department of defense buildings; effective 7/1/2040. (SD2)	EBM, JUD
SB 2290, SD2 (SSCR2623) Status	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Amends the state private investment fund to direct its investment capital to venture capital funds that commit to equity investments in businesses located within the state and demonstrate ability to mentor entrepreneurs; authorizes an unspecified amount for tax credits to be used by the fund as collateral. Effective 07/01/2050.	EBM, FIN
SB 2291, SD2 (SSCR2607) Status	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Requires the state procurement office to authorize reseller agreements in multi-state contracting agreements. Effective 7/1/50. (SD2)	EBM, FIN
SB 2137, SD1 (SSCR2559) Status	RELATING TO HEALTH CLUBS. Allows military personnel deployed outside the State on federal active duty to cancel or suspend health club membership at any time during the contract term under certain conditions. Requires pro rata refund of fees. (SD1)	EBM, CPC

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.



While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
