<u>HB 2157, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR220-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EXPANDED ADULT RESIDENTIAL CARE HOMES. Increases capacity from two to three nursing facility level residents in Type I Expanded Adult Residential Care Homes. Effective January 1, 2050.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2091</u> <u>(HSCR71-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY. Requires the department of human services to provide medicaid presumptive eligibility to patients who have been waitlisted for long-term care; and conduct a study of a computerized medicaid applications system; requires reports to the legislature.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2061, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR388-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILDREN. Statutorily establishes a process by which the Family Court can resolve matters regarding custody and visitation for service members of the United States armed forces, armed forces reserves, and National Guard whose military duties require temporary absences. Effective July 1, 2050.	HUS, FIN
<u>HB 744, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR323)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. Creates and implements a silver alert program to be operated concurrently with the Maile Amber Alert program.	HUS, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
