<u>HB 2641</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII PROJECTS. Extends the sunset provision in Act 138, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, relating to providing funding to the University of Hawaii to construct or renovate housing units.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2670</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Lifts the cap on the amount of expenditures that the UH Board of Regents can authorize from the University of Hawaii Tuition and Fees Special Fund.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2685</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BUDGET. Requires the University of Hawaii to use zero-based budgeting principles in formulating the budget for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2701</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Establishes a task force to develop a strategic plan to increase the commercialization of University of Hawaii's research.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 2921</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LICENSING. Revises minimum requirements for licensing electricians and plumbers.	HED, CPC

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.


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WEB: For comments less than 4MB in size, transmit from the Web page at <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/emailtestimony>.
