SB 2270, SD2  
(SSCR2484)  
Status

RELATING TO MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENTS.  
Requires medicaid reimbursement to hospitals for patients occupying acute-licensed beds who are on a waitlist for long-term care to be at least equal to the rate paid for acute care services; requires medicaid reimbursement to long-term care facilities for patients with medically complex conditions to be at least equal to the rate paid for subacute care; appropriates funds for increased reimbursements. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)

SB 2810, SD2  
(SSCR2441)  
Status

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.  
Authorizes pharmacists to provide medication therapy management to qualified QUEST patients. Requires pharmacies to have written collaborative pharmacy practice agreements on file for each qualified patient and have an electronically maintained patient records system for each qualified patient.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW




Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
