<u>HB 2091</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY. Requires the department of human services to provide medicaid presumptive eligibility to patients who have been waitlisted for long-term care; and conduct a study of a computerized medicaid applications system; requires reports to the legislature.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2144</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE CAUCUSES. Establishes a joint legislative keiki caucus and a joint legislative kupuna caucus.	HUS/HLT, LMG, FIN
<u>HB 1886</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CASE MANAGERS. Requires certification by the Commission for Case Manager Certification for a case manager to practice as a certified case manager in the State.	HUS/HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 2154</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE CASE MANAGEMENT. Convenes a temporary Health Care Case Management Task Force to research the quality of care provided by case managers and case management agencies and to ensure that standards of practice are consistently followed.	HUS/HLT, FIN



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

PAPER: One copy (the original) to Room 315 in the State Capitol;


EMAIL: For comments less than 5 pages in length, transmit to HUSstestimony@Capitol.hawaii.gov ; or

WEB: For comments less than 4MB in size, transmit from the Web page at <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/emailtestimony>.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
