<u>HB 2990</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAID. Recodifies current Hawaii Medicaid statutes under a new Medicaid Chapter.	HUS/HLT, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2155</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CASE MANAGEMENT. Requires case management agencies and case managers to adhere to a professional code of conduct. Establishes requirements for code of conduct.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2157</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EXPANDED ADULT RESIDENTIAL CARE HOMES. Increases capacity from two to three nursing facility level residents in Type I Expanded Adult Residential Care Homes.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2160</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO NURSE AIDES. Provides that biannual maintenance and continuing education hours required for nurse aides include a competency evaluation approved by the Department of Human Services.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2260</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO QUEST HEALTH CARE PAYMENTS. Restores adult dental care under QUEST.	HUS/HLT, FIN



<u>HB 2467</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. Requires the Department of Human Services to provide medical assistance for dialysis, chemotherapy, inpatient and outpatient physician visits, and drug prescriptions for immigrants and noncitizens from the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, or Palau. <u>HB 2469</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ADDRESS THE BUDGET SHORTFALL FOR HAWAII QUEST. Makes an emergency appropriation from the Emergency and Budget Reserve Fund to meet the general fund shortfall for payments to managed care plans contracted with the Department of Human Services to provide QUEST services.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2774</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES. Directs the department of human services to replace its QUEST program with the predecessor public assistance programs including the state health insurance program.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2978</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CARE HOMES. Creates a uniform set of regulations concerning home and community-based residential care homes. Repeals current provisions relating to adult residential care homes, expanded adult residential care homes, and community care foster family homes.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 2983</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION. Makes a technical amendment to law on psychotropic medication.	HUS/HLT, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

WEB: For comments less than 4MB in size, transmit from the Web page at <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/emailtestimony>.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.


