Requires motor vehicle dealers to possess or have the right to possess a legal ownership certificate for a motor vehicle before selling a new or used vehicle or advertising a new or used vehicle for sale. | <u>SB 549, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1088)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE EXPRESS WARRANTY ENFORCEMENT. Amends Hawaii's lemon law to include motorcycles in the definition of "motor vehicles". (SD1) | CPC, JUD |
| <u>SB 782, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1067)</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY. Establishes eligibility for unemployment insurance. Effective 07/01/2112. (SB782 HD1) | LAB/EBM, JUD, FIN |
| <u>HB 1752</u> <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO REPEAT OFFENDERS. Excludes non-violent offenders from repeat offenders statute requiring mandatory minimum prison terms. | JUD |

| <u>SB 898, SD2</u> (HSCR1129) <u>Status</u> | RELATING TO CIVIL DEFENSE. Supports State Civil Defense's Shelter-in-Place initiative by exempting civil liability for care homes and schools, in addition to hotels, during an officially designated emergency. (SD2) | PBS, JUD |
| <u>HB 1205</u> <u>Status</u> | PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE VII, SECTIONS 12 AND 13, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII RELATING TO TAX INCREMENT BONDS. DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.


