SB 701, SD2, HD1

(HSCR1288)

Status

RELATING TO LANDFILLS.

Places a moratorium on or after 8/1/09, on construction of any new solid waste landfills and the expansion of any existing private solid waste landfills in the: (1) Ewa district; (2) Waianae district; (3) Waialua district; (4) Koolauloa district; and (5) Koolaupoko district. Provides exemption from prohibition for Waimanalo Gulch Sanitary Landfill. (HD1)

HB 2721

Status

RELATING TO COURT REPORTERS.

Authorizes certified shorthand reporters to administer oaths or affirmations and to perform the duties of a deposition officer.

Status

RELATING TO COASTAL AREAS.

Requires maintenance of public beach accesses by adjacent landowners and imposes penalties for noncompliance. Establishes shoreline access as an policy of the Coastal Zone Management Program. (HB1808 HD1)

HB 2008

Status

RELATING TO DANGEROUS INSTRUMENTS.

Expands scope of offenses of terroristic threatening in the first degree and robbery in the first degree to include the use of a replica firearm.

Status

RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER.

Permits tethering of an unattended dog if the tether meets certain specifications and the dog is at least 6 months old. Establishes mandatory fines.

<u>HB 2725</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ANIMALS. Amends the definition of necessary sustenance to include a primary pet enclosure that provides shelter; safe construction to prevent injury; room to stand, sit, or lie down; and safe interactions with other animals.	JUD
<u>HB 2397</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PRIMARY ELECTIONS. Moves the date of the primary election to the second Saturday of August. Requires nomination papers to be filed not later than 4:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday in June.	JUD
<u>HB 2341</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STATUTORY REVISION: AMENDING OR REPEALING VARIOUS PROVISIONS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES AND THE SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII FOR THE PURPOSE OF CORRECTING ERRORS AND REFERENCES, CLARIFYING LANGUAGE, AND DELETING OBSOLETE OR UNNECESSARY PROVISIONS. Amends or repeals various provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and the Session Laws of Hawaii for the purpose of correcting errors and references, clarifying language, and deleting obsolete or unnecessary provisions.	JUD
<u>HB 2508</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES. Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees.	JUD, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing with a transmittal cover indicating:

- The Committee the comments are directed to;
- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.


Testimony submitted will be placed on the Legislative Web site after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the Web site should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
