<u>HB 2265, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR155-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FAMILY COURTS. Amends custody and visitation criteria and procedure to specify what courts will consider in determining the best interest of the child. Effective January 1, 2050. (HD2265 HD1)	HUS, JUD
<u>HB 2473</u> <u>(HSCR77-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WORKPLACE PRACTICES. Makes abusive conduct against an employee in the workplace a violation of occupational safety and health law.	LAB, JUD

<u>HB 1987, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR69-10)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Establishes a cause of action to abate the illegal purchasing, selling, possession, setting off, igniting or discharging of fireworks. Allows the court to order the closure of any place used in violation of the fireworks law. Allows for the forfeiture of property used in violation of the fireworks law. (HB1987 HD1)	PBS, JUD

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **January 22, 2010**.

<u>HB 1752</u>	RELATING TO REPEAT OFFENDERS.	JUD
<u>Status</u>	Excludes non-violent offenders from repeat offenders statute requiring mandatory minimum prison terms.	

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **February 16, 2010**.

<u>HB 1756</u>	RELATING TO CRIMINAL PROCEDURE.	JUD
<u>Status</u>	Allows for expungement of convictions for non-violent offenses that are over 5 years old.


WEB: For comments less than 4MB in size, transmit from the Web page at <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/emailtestimony>.
