RELATING TO AN AUDIT OF CONTRACTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY WITH THE CORRECTIONS CORPORATION OF AMERICA AND THE FEDERAL DETENTION CENTER.

Directs the auditor to conduct a financial and management audit of the Department of Public Safety's contract with the Corrections Corporation of America.

RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.

Allows department of public safety to parole up to an additional 200 inmates who do not have to return to prison each night and upon special conditions if the prison has insufficient number of beds to accommodate more furloughed inmates. Requires DPS to report to legislature semi-annually.

RELATING TO THE CIVIL DEFENSE AND EMERGENCY ACT.

Extends immunity from liability to a person who voluntarily permits the use of the person's property to shelter people during a natural or man-made disaster.

SB 2502 Testimony Status	<p>MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE HAWAII CIVIL AIR PATROL FOR OPERATING EXPENSES.</p> <p>Appropriates funds to the Hawaii civil air patrol for tsunami operations in Hawaii.</p>	PSM, WAM
SB 2768 Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO PAROLE.</p> <p>Allows the Hawaii paroling authority to use a continuum of administrative sanctions when a parolee violates a term or condition of parole.</p>	PSM, JGO
SB 2243 Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.</p> <p>Requires bills to amend or create new offenses, or to change parole or probation procedures, to be accompanied by a correctional impact statement. Requires assistance of the corrections population management commission to prepare corrections population impact.</p>	PSM, JGO
SB 2534 Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO BAIL.</p> <p>Requires law enforcement agencies to accept cash bail, certified copies of pre-filed bail bonds, and original bail bonds when the court is closed, including nights, weekends, and holidays. Specifies from whom bail may be accepted. Requires prompt release after acceptance of bail.</p>	PSM, JGO
SB 2342 Testimony Status	<p>RELATING TO SENTENCING.</p> <p>Permits certain non-violent repeat offenders convicted of drug possession to be sentenced to alternative programs instead of to prison.</p>	PSM, JGO
