<u>HB 2583</u> Status	RELATING TO IMPOUNDED VESSELS. Clarifies that all costs and expenses associated with the disposal of an impounded unauthorized vessel by the Department of Land and Natural Resources shall be borne by the vessel owner.	WLO, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2171</u> Status	RELATING TO CONVEYANCE TAX. Requires the director of taxation to provide the administrator of each county's real property assessment division with an image of all certificates of conveyances filed with the bureau of conveyances.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 2561</u> Status	RELATING TO LANDS CONTROLLED BY THE STATE. Restores the law with regard to non-ceded lands controlled by the State, to what it was prior to the passage of Act 176, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 2833</u> Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Authorizes the board of land and natural resources to extend a lease of public lands for commercial, hotel, resort, or industrial uses for 55 years upon a development agreement to improve the land.	WLO, FIN
<u>HB 2904</u> Status	RELATING TO COUNTY GENERAL PLANS. Prohibits the use of county general and development plans from serving as, or replacing the county regulatory powers.	WLO, JUD
<u>HB 2669</u> Status	RELATING TO WALU. Prohibits the catching, selling, or possession of walu in Hawaii.	WLO, JUD



DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 1 copies (including an original) to Room 438 in the State Capitol;


