[HB 2169, HD1](#) RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY. LAB, FIN
[\(HSCR47-10\)](#) Sets, for calendar year 2010, the employer contribution rate at schedule D and the wage base at 90% of the average annual wage. Sets, for calendar year 2011, the employer contribution rate at schedule G. Retains the maximum weekly benefit rate beginning 01/01/2011 at 75% of the average weekly wage. Authorizes special assessments upon employers to pay the interest costs on loans received from the U.S. Secretary of Labor. Requires the department of labor and industrial relations to conduct rate assessments every six months beginning in 2012. Establishes for recalculation of the adequate reserve fund beginning in 2011.

Allows commercial motor vehicles having a USDOT number for interstate transportation to enter the State's harbors to transport goods destined for interstate commerce.

Conform sections 286-240(g) and (h), HRS to the federal commercial driver licensing law to meet the requirements of 49 CFR Section 383.51(e) before September 4, 2010, as required by Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). <u>HB 2604</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER LICENSING. Extend the term of a commercial driver's license (CDL) for persons 21 years through 71 years from six years to eight years to prepare for the REAL ID Act, which is a nationwide effort to improve the integrity and security of state-issued driver licenses and identification cards, to help fight terrorism and reduce fraud. Appropriate \$8,000 out of the state highway fund.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 2605</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SAFETY INSPECTION OF MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLES. Conform sections 286-207 and 286-209, HRS to be compatible to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR) and avoid any type of sanctions levied by the FMCSA.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 2606</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING. Differentiate category four motor vehicles from commercial motor vehicles to clarify that category four motor vehicles do not include commercial motor vehicles as defined in section 286-2, HRS.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 2623</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Appropriates moneys from the highway development special fund to conduct a feasibility study to implement an intelligent transportation system on the island of Maui.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 2708</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Requires the Department of Transportation to establish a public involvement process when developing the statewide transportation plan.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 2301</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRANSFER OF STATE HIGHWAYS. Creates a pilot project to transfer jurisdiction of state highways in Maui county from the state department of transportation to the Maui department of transportation.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 2215</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC HIGHWAYS. Prohibits vending on any scenic lookout, pull-off, or turnaround area of a public highway.	TRN, JUD

[HB 2296](#) RELATING TO CRIME. TRN, JUD
[Status](#) Amends drivers license revocation provision to require a lifetime revocation when a driver is convicted of manslaughter involving the operation of a vehicle. Requires license revocation of five to ten years when a driver is convicted for negligent homicide in the first degree. Allows for up to two years of imprisonment when a convicted defendant is sentenced to probation for manslaughter.

[Status](#) Imposes reserved housing requirement for residential and commercial planned development permit projects greater than 45 feet in height or containing a floor area ratio greater than 1 1/2 on a lot 20,000 square feet or greater in size in the Kakaako community development district, mauka area.
