**Statement of

Chair Stanley and members of the Legislative Federal Economic Stimulus Program Oversight Commission, thank you for this opportunity to provide the Commission with an update of State ARRA activities.

State of Hawaii entities to date have received 164 awards totaling \$1,286,763,702 and spent \$584,643,413 or about 45% of the funds awarded.

Of the \$584,643,413 expended so far a large portion has been with two programs: \$206,000,000 for the extension of unemployment compensation and \$233,058,630 in aid to the state government through the Federal Medical Assistance Program or FMAP.

State of Hawaii entities collectively reported 1,810.77 jobs saved or created for the period January through March 2010. All ARRA recipients in Hawaii reported a total of 2,561.57 for the quarter. And the Council of Economic Advisors estimates that the total job impact for Hawaii due to ARRA for this quarter was 11,000 jobs.

The ARRA package has had an impact on employment and economic output. The primary benefit thus far has been in tax relief, state fiscal relief, and additional social benefits to individuals.

Going forward, we should expect to see a greater percentage of ARRA spending coming from federal and state investment outlays in transportation, housing, energy, education, and health and human services.

Hawaii is also participating in the major "reinvestment" pieces of the ARRA:

Health Information Exchange: The Governor has designed the Hawaii Health Information Exchange (HHIE) to receive federal funds to create a State HIE strategic and operational plan. The HHIE has also won a \$5.8 million competitive regional extension center grant to build a

regional extension center that will prepare private health care providers to integrate their records statewide. Finally, the University of Hawaii at Hilo has won a competitive \$16 million Beacon Community Grant to implement a region-wide Health Information Exchange and Patient Health Record solution to increase specialty care for patients.

Broadband: The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs in partnership with the University of Hawaii has been awarded \$1.9 million for broadband mapping activities.

Energy: The Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism's Energy Division has plans to use ARRA funds to transform Hawaii's energy future using the Hawaii Clean Energy Initiative (HCEI) framework.

Education: The Governor and the Department of Education recently submitted a Race to the Top application that has been rated competitive by outside reviewers.

Success in these areas will have an impact on Hawaii's overall economic competitiveness.

The State of Hawaii is using the Hawaii ARRA Accountability System (HARRAAS) to manage ARRA funds.

The objectives of the Hawaii ARRA Accountability System are to:

1. Avoid waste, fraud and abuse;
2. Ensure that costs charged to Recovery Act programs are allowable costs, in accordance with applicable laws, regulations, agreements and contracts;
3. Ensure that funds provided under Recovery Act awards are separately accounted for, from receipt to obligation to expenditure;
4. Ensure that effective cash management is employed for Recovery funds to minimize the time elapsing between (i) the transfer of funds from the Federal Government, or from a pass-through entity, to (ii) disbursement;
5. Ensure that the use of Recovery funds meet all federal requirements as described in individual ARRA grant awards and OMB Circulars;
6. Fulfill Recovery Act reporting requirements in a timely and accurate manner.

Under the Hawaii ARRA Accountability System:

1. The head of state entities are the ARRA Coordinators
2. ARRA coordinators form an inter-agency ARRA Recovery Team made up of key program and fiscal and accounting personnel
3. ARRA Recovery Teams create State Agency Recovery Plans and post these plans on the official State of Hawaii ARRA website: www.hawaii.gov/recovery.
4. ARRA Coordinators implement the Recovery plans.

Since the Committees last meeting I have spent time making sure departments and state entities understand their role under the Hawaii ARRA Accountability System. In addition, I have reconciled each ARRA award by federal award ID to a unique state appropriation symbol. My

office is now able to compare what state entities are reporting against accounting information in the state's official accounting system (FAMIS). Data quality issues are apparent and we will address these issues by providing additional guidance to state entities in the next reporting period. I am confident we can improve data quality and thus transparency.

Finally, to help provide oversight for ARRA activities, the Governor has approved the creation of a two person, Office of Economic Recovery and Reinvestment (OERR) at the Department Budget and Finance (B&F). I expect the OERR to be established by the end of June.

Before I go over the website, I would like to thank the members of the Oversight Committee, Hawaii's Congressional Delegation, the Governor, and the ARRA coordinators from each state entity for their active support of ARRA.

Our ability to work together and communicate openly has so far allowed us to meet the challenge of receiving and expending funds under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

Now I would like to review with the Committee the State of Hawaii ARRA site (www.hawaii.gov/recovery).
