HB1844 RELATING TO FIREWORKS. TCI, PBS, JUD

Imposes a statewide ban on consumer fireworks, except for

religious and cultural events.

HB1845 RELATING TO FIREWORKS. TCI/PBS, JUD, FIN

Increases the fee to purchase consumer fireworks. Generally, increases the penalty for fireworks violations. Transfers all proceeds collected from fireworks violations to the state.

Requires a study on the negative effects of the use of fireworks in the State. Includes religious events in the definition of "cultural". Imposes a graduated fireworks fee system to discourage large

purchases of fireworks.

HB1846 RELATING TO FUNDING FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE JUD, HUS, FIN

AND SEX ASSAULT SERVICES.

Restores cuts in funding for domestic violence and sexual assault services to fiscal year 2008-2009 levels. Appropriates funds to the department of the attorney general for sexual assault services

and to the judiciary for domestic violence services.

<u>HB1847</u> RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF NURSING.

HLT, CPC

Defines the practice of nursing; directs the state board of nursing to adopt certain provisions of the NCSBN Model Nursing Practice Act and Model Nursing Administrative Rules; delineates the scope of practice for registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, and advanced practice registered nurses; repeals Hawaii Administrative Rules relating to prescriptive authority for advanced practice registered nurses.

<u>HB1848</u> RELATING TO CAPITAL INVESTMENTS.

FIN

Defines agency-wide technology and computer system projects as capital investments to allow them to be financed with bond funds and depreciated as capital investments.

<u>HB1849</u> RELATING TO ELECTRONIC WARRANT VOUCHERS.

EDN/HED. FIN

Allows the department of education, department of accounting and general services, and the University of Hawaii to accept electronically mailed warrant vouchers for bills of materials, supplies, and incidentals as original documentation, the receipt of which authorizes payment to be made to each individual to whom the State is indebted.

HB1850 RELATING TO PREAUDITS FOR PROPOSED PAYMENTS.

EDN/HED, FIN

Clarifies that the department of education is required to preaudit proposed payments of \$10,000 or more. Allows the University of Hawaii and the department of education to preaudit sample populations for proposed payments of less than \$10,000 to determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with applicable laws, executive orders, and rules, as their respective chief financial officers determine to be appropriate. Extends the date until which the University of Hawaii and the department of education shall have autonomous authority over their accounting systems and other purchasing responsibilities and duties.

<u>HB1851</u> RELATING TO INDEMNIFICATION OF COUNTY

AGENCIES.

Facilitates the process by which the department of education obtains approval for the State to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless a county agency, its officers, agents, and employees for public school purposes and functions on county facilities.

HB1852 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

Repeals the school-level minor repair and maintenance account.

Establishes the Office of Disaster Preparedness and a Disaster Preparedness Commission to develop a disaster preparedness plan for Hawaii that includes the identification of hazards and hazard impact zones, disaster mitigation policies, requirements, incentives, and best responses.

Establishes a construction authority to be attached to the department of accounting and general services to oversee statewide procurement for construction, the facilitation of permit processing, and professional and vocational licensing of contractors, electricians, plumbers, elevator mechanics, professional engineers, architects, surveyors, and landscape architects. Creates a special fund funded by professional licensing fees and the general excise tax upon contractors.

EEP

Establishes criminal penalties for fraudulent installation or reinstallation of an airbag. Requires that any person engaged in the business of purchasing, selling, or installing an airbag maintain detailed records of airbags they purchase, sell, or install. Mandates that any person engaged in the business of installing an airbag submit an affidavit to a vehicle owner saying that an airbag was installed properly. Requires a person repairing a vehicle to affix a permanent dashboard label disclosing that a salvaged airbag had been used. Establishes that police accident reports must note whether an airbag deployed. Requires that a person trading or selling a motor vehicle must disclose whether an airbag is inoperable.

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.

HB1903

LAB, FIN Transfers funds from the general fund into the unemployment compensation fund to pay unemployment benefits to persons who were laid off from state employment because of a reductionin-force. Appropriates funds to pay all accumulated vacation

leave for persons who retired from state employment or were laid off from state employment because of a reduction-in-force. Appropriates funds to pay the additional health benefits plan costs for persons who retired from state employment and their

dependent-beneficiaries.

HB1904 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. LAB, FIN

Requires the set aside from the general excise tax revenues of an amount equivalent to the unfunded accrued liability contribution by the State for state employees. Takes effect on 07/01/11.

HB1905

RELATING TO STATE PAYMENTS.

LAB, FIN

Remits general excise tax funds to pay fringe benefit contributions and tax refunds not paid in previous fiscal years to balance the state budget. Act takes effect on 07/01/2011.

HB1906

RELATING TO TAXATION.

CPC, FIN

Requires holders of professional or vocational licenses to provide to the department of commerce and consumer affairs a tax clearance issued by the department of taxation as a condition to

license issuance or renewal.

HB1907

RELATING TO TAXATION.

FIN

Temporarily suspends the income tax net operating loss carryback deduction for losses generated in 2009 and 2010.

HB1908

RELATING TO THE MANAGEMENT OF STATE FUNDS.

Increases the central service expenses fee applied to special funds from 5% to 6%. Removes special exemptions from the central service expenses fee, except where prohibited by law.

Takes effect on 7/1/10 and sunsets on 6/30/15.

HB1923 RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN Establishes a waiver program to exempt a taxpayer's wagering winnings acquired during a consecutive five-day period. RELATING TO TAX DEDUCTIONS. FIN HB1924 Restores the limited state income tax deduction for gambling losses retroactively for taxable years beginning after 12/31/08. HB1925 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX. **FIN** Temporarily restricts the general excise tax exemption for timeshare associations to \$400,000. Removes sunset for GET exemption for a submanager of an association of apartment owners and a reference to chapter 514A, HRS in the same exemption and changes the effective date of the provision to

7/1/06.

HB1926 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

EBM/CPC, FIN

Establishes the department of business, economic development, and tourism operation special fund. Imposes a surcharge on the fees charged by certain departments for certain business- and commerce-related authorizations and services. Requires the deposit of the surcharge revenues, as well as \$2 million from the financial institutions tax, into the special fund. Requires moneys in the special fund to be used for the operation of the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Takes effect on 7/1/10 and sunsets on 6/30/15.

<u>HB1927</u> RELATING TO OWNER-BUILDERS.

CPC, FIN

Amends Chapter 444 by: (1) Allowing an exemption for the sale or lease of a property by an owner builder prior to the expiration of the one-year prohibition period in the event of hardship; (2) Defining when a construction or improvement is completed; (3) Exempting improvements of less than \$10,000 in value; (4) Exempting lenders and mortgages in cases of non-judicial foreclosure; (5) Creating a rebuttable presumption that an owner or lessee is in violation when more than one exemption is obtained within five years. Increases the handyman exemption to \$2,000.

HB1928 RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

EEP, JUD

Authorizes owners of adjoining property to enter private property to remove invasive species.
