HB2511 RELATING TO IDENTITY THEFT. JUD Amends the identity theft offenses and the definition of "personal information" in chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to clarify that the identity theft offenses include the transmission of personal information of an actual person, alive or dead, or a fictitious person. HB2512 RELATING TO VIOLATION OF PRIVACY. JUD Amends the offense of violation of privacy in the second degree to remove any potential conflict with the offense of violation of privacy in the first degree, and adds violation of privacy in the first degree to the repeat offender law. RELATING TO DEFERRED ACCEPTANCE OF PLEA. JUD HB2513 Clarifies that the provisions precluding deferred acceptance of plea when a defendant has previously been granted a deferred acceptance of guilty plea status is also applicable when a defendant has previously been granted a deferred acceptance of nolo contendere ("no contest") plea status. HB2514 RELATING TO SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION. RELATING TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE **HSG** HB2568 HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Reduces the quorum requirement for the board of directors of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority. RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. HB2569 LAB, FIN Requires the State and counties to negotiate and execute separate collective bargaining agreements with exclusive representatives of public employee organizations.
