CHEMICALLY DEPENDANT NURSES.

Amends requirements for diversion programs for chemically dependent nurses to allow the board of nursing to recognize alternative program sponsors. Clarifies disciplinary and

reporting requirements.

HB2839 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR

THE BENEFIT OF THE EIGHTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE

DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects for the

benefit of the 18th representative district.

HB2840 RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. WLO, FIN

Fills gaps in the historic review process for proposed projects on undeveloped private lands by requiring a landowner or developer to obtain the written concurrence of the State Historic

Preservation Division and conduct a public meeting for any draft mitigation plans prior to obtaining a permit or other approval. Requires publication of "no historic properties affected"

comments.

<u>HB2841</u> RELATING TO ETHICS. JUD, FIN

Requires lobbyists and their clients to make monthly disclosures during any month the legislature is in session, and a report for June 1 through December 31. Adds required disclosures regarding lobbying events, contractual relationships with legislators, and campaign contributions. Requires the governor, lieutenant governor, and legislators to file their financial disclosures within 30 days of the beginning of the legislative session. Requires certain state employees to disclose contractual relationships with lobbyists and their clients. Prohibits public funds from being used to hire lobbyists and to purchase gifts for

state employees.

HB2842 RELATING TO TAXATION.

LAB/EBM, FIN

Creates a tax credit for employers who fund continuing education for certain employees to improve their existing skills; limits the amount of employer contributions paid under the employment security laws for the 2010 and 2011 calendar years even if the employer hires a certain number of additional employees.

HB2843 RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

EBM, FIN

Transfers the powers and responsibilities of the Hawaii Strategic Development Corporation (HSDC) to the High Technology Development Corporation; makes the HSDC board an advisory committee on issues pertaining to HSDC functions.

HB2844 RELATING TO THE FILM INDUSTRY.

EBM, FIN

Creates a film industry branch special fund with revenues from a general exercise tax surcharge on motion picture theaters and television broadcasting stations and fees charged by the department of business, economic development, and tourism for its film industry activities.

HB2845 RELATING TO LANDS CONTROLLED BY THE STATE.

WLO/HSG, FIN

Exempts the fee simple resale of individual dwelling units acquired by the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation pursuant to foreclosure or a buyback provision from legislative approval requirements.

HB2846 RELATING TO KAKAAKO.

WLO/HSG

Increases the reserved housing requirement for a major development on a lot of at least 1 acre in the Kakaako community development district, mauka area. Requires the Hawaii community development authority to adopt or amend rules.

HB2847 RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS.

PBS/HLT/AGR,

JUD, FIN

Amends the term "medical marijuana" to "medical cannabis"; transfers the administration of the program from the department of public safety to the department of health. Establishes procedure for employment-related marijuana drug testing and review of results by medical review officer. Directs the department of health to establish a system of distribution outlets. Directs the counties to establish a system to license, tax, and regulate medical cannabis family farms. Directs the department of health, in consultation with the University of Hawaii, to establish a system to license research and development for medical cannabis related products. Allows out-of-state visitors who are qualifying patients or primary caregivers to apply for a temporary registration certificate. Permits transport of medical marijuana if certain conditions are met.

Committee REFERRAL HB2848 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION ENERGY EEP/TRN, FIN INITIATIVES. Changes "electric vehicle" reference to "G-vehicles or "green vehicles" in laws requiring facilities to designate parking spaces for green vehicles, and establishing penalties for misuse of green vehicle parking. WLO/HSG HB2849 RELATING TO KAKAAKO. Imposes reserved housing requirement for residential and commercial planned development permit projects greater than 45 feet in height or containing a floor area ratio greater than 1 1/2 on a lot 20,000 square feet or greater in size in the Kakaako community development district, mauka area. HB2850 RELATING TO THE LIQUOR TAX. **FIN** Temporarily increases the liquor tax rates during the period of 7/1/10 to 6/30/15. RELATING TO INSURANCE. **FIN** HB2851 Increases the insurance premium tax rates. Repeals the ceiling on insurance premium taxes payable by a captive insurance company. Takes effect on 7/1/10 and sunsets on 06/30/15. RELATING TO THE INSURANCE PREMIUM TAX. FIN HB2852 Temporarily makes the insurance premium tax applicable to mutual benefit societies and health maintenance organizations. Establishes a medical and health promotion tax credit. Authorizes the insurance commissioner to adjust any inadequate rates for the managed care plans of mutual benefit societies and health maintenance organizations. RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY TAX. HB2853 FIN Increases the public service company tax rate applicable to public utilities. Takes effect on 07/01/10, and sunsets on 06/30/15.

<u>HB2854</u> RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Makes public employer contributions to the employer-union health benefits trust fund non-negotiable under collective bargaining. Establishes a single flat dollar amount as the public employer's contribution the health benefit plan or plans of each public employee. Repeals group life insurance benefits. Makes various other amendments, including: (1) requiring one of the employer trustees to represent the county employers; (2) allowing a trustee to hold over after the end of the trustee's term until the earlier of: the date the trustee's successor is appointed or the 180th day following the end of the trustee's term; (3) reducing some of the administrative authority of the director of finance over the trust fund; and (4) adding certain duties for the board. Takes effect on 7/1/2011.

HB2855 RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB, FIN

Requires the board of trustees of the employees' retirement system to study and recommend a plan to fully amortize the unfunded actuarial accrued liability of the system over a 30-year period.

HB2856 RELATING TO NEW PUBLIC EMPLOYEES. LAB, FIN

Requires the board of trustees of the employees' retirement system to study and recommend a defined contribution plan for new public employees. Prohibits new employees from becoming eligible for membership in or benefits under existing defined benefit plan if legislation to establish defined contribution plan not enacted.

HB2857 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. LAB, FIN

Divides pertinent public employees' collective bargaining units into separate state and county units. Removes, for certain collective bargaining units, the provision for mandatory arbitration to resolve an impasse over negotiations. Requires an arbitration panel or arbitrator to select one party's final position in its entirety as the final agreement. Requires a public employer and collective bargaining unit to agree to a single dollar amount as the health benefits plan contribution for every employee in the unit. Repeals group life insurance benefit provisions.

HB2858 RELATING TO FURLOUGHS. LAB, JUD, FIN

Specifies that a "furlough" relates to an employee's wages and hours of employment and constitutes a term or condition of employment that is subject to collective bargaining.

<u>HB2859</u> RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Requires the board of trustees of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund to design and offer a health benefits plan for active state employees and their dependent-beneficiaries that does not exceed a specified maximum contribution by the State.

HB2860 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Requires, from 7/1/2011 until 6/30/2015, the employer-union health benefits trust fund to provide to active state employees and their dependent-beneficiaries the minimum health benefits plan required under the Hawaii prepaid health care act. Does not affect active county or retired state and county employees and their dependent-beneficiaries.

HB2861 RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Requires excess reserves and investment and other earnings of the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund to be used to defray the employers' contribution towards the health benefits plan costs of retirees. Allows a portion of the earnings to be used for administrative and other expenses of the fund. Takes effect on 07/01/10 and sunsets on 06/30/15.

HB2862

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Makes various amendments to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund law: (1) establishes a tiered system of employer contributions for the medicare part B premiums of new employees who first enter service after 06/30/2010 and subsequently retire, based on their years of service before retirement; (2) when a retired employee is married to an active employee, renders the retired employee ineligible to enroll in a health benefits plan that provides coverage for the active employee; (3) when a retired employee is privately employed and eligible for prepaid health care coverage, renders the retired employee ineligible to enroll in a two-party or family plan that covers the spouse unless the spouse also is enrolled in the prepaid health care plan; (4) requires the board to periodically evaluate the health benefits plan for retired employees to determine compliance with the requirements that the plan not duplicate medicare benefits and be secondary to medicare; (5) provides that the employers' contribution for the medicare part B premium shall be based on the least costly medicare part B premium rate and made only for a retired employee; (6) provides medicare part B contributions to a retired employee's spouse only if the employee retired before 01/01/2011; (7) requires a retired employee to enroll in both medicare part B and a medical benefits plan of the fund as a condition for receiving reimbursements for medicare part B premiums; (8) requires a retired employee's spouse who is eligible to enroll in the medicare part B medical insurance plan to enroll in that plan as a condition for participating in a health benefits plan of the fund; and (9) requires the annual adjustment of the base monthly contribution for retired employees to be based on the least costly medicare part B premium rate.

HB2863

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH LAB, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Prohibits the State from making contributions for group life insurance benefits for state employees under the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund. Takes effect on 7/1/2010 and sunsets on 6/30/2015.

HB2864

RELATING TO THE HEALTH FUND.

LAB, FIN

Establishes a formula for the reimbursement of the state general fund from non-general funds for health fund contributions for retired state employees.

Imposes for taxable years beginning after 12/31/2009 and ending on 12/31/2011, an income surtax on a state employee whose regular wages were paid with non-general funds and not reduced because of furlough, collective bargaining agreement, or general law. Sets the surtax at 4% of the state employee's regular wages that were paid from non-general funds.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB2872</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Increases the tax rate for banks and other financial corporations. Repeals requirement that \$2,000,000 of tax revenues from banks and other financial corporations be deposited into the compliance resolution fund. Authorizes the commissioner of financial institutions to expedite the imposition of fees on banks and other financial corporations. Takes effect on 07/01/10 and sunsets on 12/31/15. Applies change to entire net income received for calendar year preceding 1/1/11 or fiscal year in which 1/1/11 occurs.	FIN

Committee REFERRAL HB2873 RELATING TO THE TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS **FIN** TAX. Suspends for 5 years from 07/01/2010 to 06/30/2015 the distribution of transient accommodations tax revenues to the counties. RELATING TO THE TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS FIN HB2874 TAX. Temporarily increases from 7/1/2010 to 6/30/2015 the transient accommodations tax rate on time share units. RELATING TO THE HAWAII HURRICANE RESERVE FIN HB2875 TRUST FUND. Authorizes the loan of moneys from the Hawaii hurricane reserve trust fund to the general fund. Prohibits transfers from the trust fund to the loss mitigation grant fund. Takes effect upon approval and sunsets on 06/30/15. RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN HB2876 Temporarily increases the general excise and use tax rates from 4% to 5%, the capital goods excise tax credit rate from 4% to 5%, and the refundable food/excise tax credit by \$10 per exemption. Takes effect on 07/01/2010 and is repealed on 06/30/2015. RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN HB2877 Suspends temporarily the exemption for certain persons and certain amounts of gross income or proceeds from the general excise tax and requires the payment of the tax at a one-half per cent rate. Takes effect on 10/01/10 and sunsets on 06/30/15. FIN RELATING TO TAXATION. HB2878 Repeals certain exemptions under the general excise, use, and public service company taxes. The Act takes effect on July 1, 2010 and sunsets on June 30, 2015. RELATING TO STATE FUNDS. FIN HB2879 Imposes a general excise tax surcharge upon gross income or gross proceeds comprised of state non-general funds. Imposes a public service company tax surcharge upon gross income comprised of state non-general funds. Imposes an insurance premium tax surcharge upon gross premiums, gross underwriting profits, and risk premiums comprised of state non-general funds. Takes effect on 7/1/2010 and sunsets on 6/30/2015.

REFERRAL HB2880 RELATING TO TAXATION. **FIN** Increases the "wholesale" rates under the general excise, use, and public service company taxes to one per cent from one-half per cent. Effective 7/1/10; repealed 6/30/15. HB2881 RELATING TO INSURANCE TAXATION. FIN Increases the general excise tax rate on insurance commissions to 4% from 0.15%. Amends the insurance code to specify that the premium for an insurance policy may include an amount intended to compensate an insurance producer for part of the general excise tax imposed on the producer's commission. Takes effect on 07/01/2010 and sunsets on 06/30/2015. RELATING TO TAXATION. HB2882 **FIN** Imposes the general excise tax at a 4% rate on the gross income from the sale of securities. Repeals the general excise tax exemption for stock or future exchanges. Takes effect on 10/01/10 and sunsets on 06/30/15, except that the repeal of the exchange exemption shall be permanent. RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN HB2883 Imposes the general excise tax at the rate of 1.0% on the gross proceeds from the sale of real property less deductions for real estate salespersons' commissions and conveyance tax payments. Takes effect on 07/01/10 and sunsets on 06/30/15. RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN HB2884 Imposes the general excise tax at the rate of 4% on the death benefits and other gross income derived by a provider of a life settlement contract. Takes effect on 07/01/10 and sunsets on 06/30/15. HB2885 RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE TAX. **FIN** Temporarily suspends the distribution of a portion of the conveyance tax to the land conservation fund and rental housing trust fund. Reduces distribution to the natural area reserve fund. RELATING TO CABLE TELEVISION. HB2886 **FIN** Temporarily requires from 7/1/2010 to 6/30/2015, the deposit of one-half of the cable television annual fee into the general fund.

HB2887 RELATING TO TOBACCO SETTLEMENT MONEYS.

FIN

Transfers temporarily to the general fund the portion of moneys from the Hawaii tobacco settlement special fund designated for the Hawaii tobacco prevention and control trust fund. Requires interest and earnings of the Hawaii tobacco settlement special fund to be deposited into the general fund. Reduces the portion of moneys from the Hawaii tobacco settlement special fund to be transferred to the tobacco enforcement special fund. Encourages the nonprofit entity responsible for the Hawaii tobacco prevention and control trust fund to increase its annual expenditures to assist in revitalizing the economy. Takes effect on 07/01/2010, and sunsets on 06/30/2015.

HB2888 RELATING TO STATE FEES.

FIN

From 7/1/10 to 6/30/15 adds a \$10 surcharge to the fee charged by a state agency for certain services. Requires the surcharge to be deposited into the general fund.

<u>HB2889</u> RELATING TO THE EMERGENCY AND BUDGET

FIN

RESERVE FUND.

Authorizes the legislature to make a loan from the emergency and budget reserve fund to the general fund by legislative act approved by a majority of each house. Requires the legislative act to identify the source of the general funds to repay the loan.

HB2890 RELATING TO TAXATION.

FIN

Imposes the income tax on a lessor of real property for capital improvements made by a lessee upon the termination of a lease.

HB2891 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' VACATION.

LAB, FIN

Requires a public employee who retires or terminates from state service between 07/01/2010 and 06/30/2015 to receive additional retirement service credit, instead of cash payment, for unused vacation leave. Takes effect on 07/01/2010, with some provisions sunsetting on 06/30/2015 and one provision sunsetting on 06/30/2017.

HB2892 RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. LAB, FIN

Sets, for fiscal year 2010-2011 only, the employers' contribution at (1) 10.7% for police officers, firefighters, and corrections officers plus regular interest on the unfunded accrued liability for this group and (2) 6% for other employees plus regular interest on the unfunded accrued liability for this group.

REFERRAL HB2893 RELATING TO STATE EMPLOYEES. LAB, FIN Provides that, under the employees' retirement system, a state employee's "compensation" does not include overtime payments, differentials, supplementary payments, bonuses, and lump sum salary supplements. States expressly that the provision does not apply to a county employee. RELATING TO FRINGE BENEFIT CONTRIBUTIONS. HB2894 LAB, FIN Requires state contributions to the employees' retirement system to be paid from the general fund on a quarterly basis. Sets the deadline for the payment as the end of the fiscal quarter following the quarter for which the contributions are to be paid. Requires departments and agencies whose employees are paid from state non-general funds to reimburse the state general fund for advance contributions. Requires the departments and agencies to pay monthly interest at 0.25% on the reimbursements. Takes effect on 07/01/2010 and is repealed on 06/30/2015. HB2895 RELATING TO FORECLOSURE. HSG, JUD Allows a homeowner to force a court supervised foreclosure if a non-judicial foreclosure is successfully appealed due to an unfair sales price. HB2896 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE FIFTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT. Appropriates funds for capital improvements projects to benefit the 5th representative district. RELATING TO CONTRACTORS. HB2897 LAB, CPC, JUD Subjects a contractor to revocation or suspension of license for knowingly or intentionally employing a person who is not eligible to work in the United States under federal law to perform work on any project or operation.
