Subject: HCR 254/HR182, REQUESTING THE COUNTIES TO REQUIRE EVIDENCE OF SUFFICIENT SPACE TO PARK A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE WHEN A PERSON APPLIES TO REGISTER THE VEHICLE


The City and County of Honolulu and the Counties of Hawaii, Kauai and Maui are opposed to HCR 254/HR 182 which requests that the counties require evidence of sufficient space to park a recreational vehicle when a person applies to register the vehicle.

The county motor vehicle registration offices do not have the expertise to read plot plans or other drawings to determine if sufficient space exists on private property to park a large size vehicle and there exists a reasonable amount of space for such a vehicle to enter and exit from such private property.

Rather than involving the county motor vehicle offices, we recommend that the Legislature request that the State Director of Transportation and the County police departments determine if a state law or county ordinance should be adopted to prohibit parking of any vehicle of a size that obstructs the view of the driver of oncoming traffic when the driver attempts to ingress or egress from a public or private driveway.

The City and County of Honolulu and the Counties of Hawaii, Kauai and Maui recommend that HCR 254/HR182 be held.
