Chair Mercado Kim and Members of the Committee:

Thank you very much for this opportunity to submit comments on Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 113, S.D. 1, concerning awareness of and support for persons with dyslexia.

The Legislative Reference Bureau (Bureau) takes **no position** either for or against the measure, but submits the following comments and concerns:

- 1. As always, if the Legislature wants us to undertake this project, we will do it to the best of our ability with the resources we have.
- 2. The Resolution requests the establishment of a committee to study and plan the transformation of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation to an organizational structure that responds more effectively to the needs of island communities.
- 3. The Bureau is requested (in the ninth "Resolved" clause) to "assist the Committee in drafting its recommendations and proposed legislation."
- 4. While the project requested of the Bureau by this particular measure appears in and of itself to be manageable, we are concerned about the cumulative effect of passage of a number of similar measures.

- 5. Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 113, S.D. 1, is one of approximately a dozen vehicles still "alive" that request the Bureau to draft proposed legislation, (and, as in this case, "recommendations" as well) for a task force, working group, or other entity. These measures are **in addition** to the usual complement of measures requesting studies.
- 6. We anticipate that many of these entities, left to their own devices, will not be formulating their proposed legislation until December or January, thus coinciding with the period of the Bureau's heaviest workload in terms of responding to requests for bills and other work from legislators in preparation for the 2011 session.
- 7. In view of the foregoing, we request that Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 113, S.D. 1, be amended to request the Committee to transmit its intended proposed legislation to the Bureau not later than November 1, 2010. This could be accomplished by amending the ninth "Resolved" clause as follows:

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to assist the Committee in drafting its recommendations and proposed legislation; *provided that the working group is requested to submit its proposals for legislation to the Legislative Reference Bureau for drafting not later than November 1, 2010;* and

8. We believe that this amendment will help to ensure that the working group's report is submitted to the Legislature in a timely manner.

Dear Senator Kim and Committee members:

Re: SCR 113, SD1

The Hawaii Island Healthcare Alliance (HIHA), better known simply as "the Alliance," is a grass-roots effort to improve access to high-quality healthcare services on Hawaii Island. Our stakeholder membership includes business and community leaders, hospital CEOs, FQHCs, HMSA, Kaiser, Workforce Development, UHH College of Pharmacy, SHPDA, County and State government representatives, physicians, and others.

The Alliance is interested in the above resolution, and would like to urge that the reso be approved, with some suggested amendments. SCR 113, SD1 is a positive step forward and worthy of support.

SCR 113, SD1, calls for establishing a Committee on Transitioning the HHSC. It requires community meetings, which is very much appreciated. It also provides that the Committee would have two community members, which is good, but the reso is not explicit as to who would appoint them, nor what criteria would be used to select them. We would urge that there be specific language that the community members be neighbor island residents, since HHSC is so critical to the neighbor islands, and we would welcome a condition that they be members of, or individuals nominated by, community or grass roots organizations which have demonstated a commitment to better healthcare for the people of Hawaii, such as the Alliance.

We would also like to comment on two other resolutions that are in WAM and deal with healthcare, in case this committee decides to incorporate any part of them into SCR 113:

SCR 122,SD1 has no reference to community input. There is a reference to "stakeholders" but we are not sure that anyone will think of "the community" in that context. Therefore we hope that SCR 122,SD1 might be amended to include a mandate that the committee being established hold public meetings, and that it seek community input. The Summit should be instructed to "seek input from consumers, community members and community groups, including from grass roots organizations such as the HIHA (the Alliance) on the Island of Hawaii..." And if possible, we would welcome language requiring that some of the appointees of the President and Speaker represent neighbor island communities, either our State or County elected officials or members of community groups dedicated to improving healthcare.

SCR 146,SD1 calls for a Task Force that includes "consumer advocates." This is close to what is needed, but the Alliance, as an example, is not so much a <u>consumer</u> advocate as a <u>community</u> advocate. Therefore we would ask for amendments here too, similar to those requested for SCR 113,SD1 and SCR 122,SD1
