I. Background and Summary

Applicant is the West Hawaii Veterans' Cemetery Development and Expansion Association (WHVCDEA) founded initially in January 2005 to address the needs of the West Hawaii Veterans' Cemetery. WHVCDEA is composed of representatives of all the active military veterans' groups in West Hawaii. Membership includes and is open to any person in the West Hawaii community interested in the cemetery's welfare.

WHVCDEA functions as the unofficial caretaker of the West Hawaii Veterans' Cemetery in cooperation with the County of Hawaii which manages and provides services to the cemetery which is State owned.

The WHVCDEA's achievements include obtaining philanthropic funding for fencing in 62 acres of cemetery land, obtaining and installing sod on the original burial field, and planting over four thousand native Hawaiian plants donated by local businesses and civic groups in an effort to reestablish the dry land forest that thrived along the coast in earlier centuries. As a consequence of six years of effort, the West Hawaii Veterans' Cemetery has evolved from a "Boot Hill" appearance to having been designated by the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs in December 2010 as "Shrine" status – an achievement matched by only two other State veterans' cemeteries in America.

In March 2005, the Internal Revenue Service issued a determination letter granting the Association exemption from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The goals and objectives of WHVCDEA are to provide sufficient justification warranting the State to construct a Veterans' Center in West Hawaii.

The public purpose of the Veterans' Center would be to serve the needs of half of the County's estimated 17,000 military veterans who would then have a single, convenient, centralized location to visit when in need of a veteran's agency or a place to meet to address veterans' issues. The facility could also be used by West Hawaii reservists and others in the community such as the Civil Air Patrol, JROTC, etc. Part of this request includes determining the scope of the project based on supporting the needs of state and county entities and the community. The Center's parking, kitchen and meeting areas will be of sufficient size so the facility is rented out to those in the community in order to be financially self-sustaining.

Locating the Veterans' Center near the entrance road of the West Hawaii Veterans' Cemetery would make it geographically central to all veterans living in West Hawaii. The proposed location is approximately halfway along the coast and not far from a major shopping area on the Kona side of the island housing popular businesses such as Costco and Home Depot. The proposed location is just off Highway 19 - the major thoroughfare along the coast.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. The scope of work includes initial planning, site selection, environmental assessments for development and architectural design and engineering work. Responsibilities will be determined by agreement with the State of Hawaii, Department of Defense (DOD), the expected expending agency. WHVCDEA will: comply with Chapter 42; employ or have under contract a qualified project coordinator; allow DOD and auditor full access to records and documents pertaining to the project to assure proper expenditure of public funds; administer the contracts for planning, design and construction, including advertisement, award, and fiscal project accounting; prepare the consultant's scopes of work; approve all requests for payment subject to DOD review; and maintain the final selection of material, equipment, and matters of user preference. DOD will: provide consultant selection support; assist in preparing scopes of work; authenticate work progress of consultants and contractors; and coordinate land acquisition.

2. Timelines are:

Land acquisition May 2011
Environmental Assessments August 2011
Design/Planning May – Dec 2011
Construction (start) Jan 2012

- 3. With DOD assistance, WHVCDEA will monitor and evaluate consultant and contractor compliance. WHVCDEA has experience with receipt of cemetery funding and monitoring outcomes. DOD has specific expertise in construction projects.
- 4. As described, the agreement between DOD and WHVCDEA will spell out responsibilities. The consultant/contractor will be required to produce deliverable products that meet established rules, regulations, specifications and DOD and WHVCDEA requirements. Any contracts will ensure deliverables achieve the necessary accomplishments.

III. Financial

Additional federal funding will be pursued on a matching basis, if the planning process results in a facility that meets the requirements for applying for federal funding. Any federal funding would apply towards the construction phase and not the assessment or design/planning phase.

WHVCDEA is capable of coordinating with DOD, the Hawaii State Office of Veteran Services (OVS) and other entities to ensure the required services are appropriately provided. WHVCDEA has previously coordinated such efforts with respect to the highly successful veterans cemetery, which recently was recognized for its superior accomplishments, as described in this excerpt from a news article:

The West Hawaii Veterans Cemetery, touted as the "Arlington of the Pacific," has been given shrine status the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

That makes the 62-acre cemetery in Kailua-Kona one of just three state-owned veterans cemeteries nationwide to have that distinction. It's the only Hawaii cemetery so recognized -- which comes with no extra money, just bragging rights, said John Grogan, president of the West Hawaii Veterans Cemetery Development and Expansion Association.

In addition, WHVCDEA is closely coordinating with the Veterans Centers on Oahu, Kauai and Maui to ensure their lessons learned are evaluated and applied to this project. The collective experience necessary for this project exists and is actively engaged.

V. Personnel

WHVCDEA has been an IRS certified 501(c)(3) organization since March 2005. WHVCDEA has a fully functioning board and with motivated officers, directors and members necessary for and capable in the management of this project.

VI. Other

WHVCDEA is not involved in any pending litigation.


