
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 " ~~§27-43~~ **Information technology; chief information**
4 **officer; information technology steering committee;**
5 **establishment; responsibilities.** (a) There is established
6 within the office of the governor a full-time chief information
7 officer to organize, manage, and oversee statewide information
8 technology governance, including supervision and oversight of
9 the information and communication services division of the
10 department of accounting and general services. The chief
11 information officer shall be appointed by the governor as
12 provided in section 26-34. The chief information officer shall
13 report directly to the governor and, in conjunction with the
14 information technology steering committee, shall:

15 (1) Develop, implement, and manage statewide information
16 technology governance;

17 (2) Develop, implement, and manage the state information
18 technology strategic plans;



- 1 (3) Develop and implement statewide technology standards;
2 (4) Report annually to the governor and the legislature on
3 the status and implementation of the state information
4 technology strategic plan; ~~and~~
5 (5) Perform other necessary or desirable functions to
6 facilitate the intent of this section~~[-]~~; and
7 (6) Employ persons that shall be exempt from chapters 76,
8 78, and 89.

9 (b) There is established an information technology
10 steering committee to assist the chief information officer in
11 developing the State's information technology standards and
12 policies, including but not limited to:

- 13 (1) Assisting the chief information officer in developing
14 and implementing the state information technology
15 strategic plans;
16 (2) Assessing executive branch departments' progress in
17 meeting the objectives defined in the state
18 information technology strategic plans and identifying
19 best practices for shared or consolidated services;
20 (3) Ensuring technology projects are selected based on
21 their potential impact and risk to the State, as well
22 as their strategic value;



- 1 (4) Ensuring that executive branch departments maintain
2 sufficient tools to assess the value and benefits of
3 technology initiatives;
- 4 (5) Assisting the chief information officer in developing
5 state information technology standards and policies;
6 and
- 7 (6) Clarifying the roles, responsibilities, and authority
8 of the information and communication services
9 division, specifically as it relates to its statewide
10 duties.

11 The members of the information technology steering
12 committee shall be appointed by the senate president and speaker
13 of the house of representatives in equal number respectively and
14 shall include representatives from executive branch departments,
15 including large user agencies such as the department of
16 education and the University of Hawaii; the judiciary; the
17 legislature; and private individuals. The chief information
18 officer shall serve as the chair of the committee and shall
19 ensure that the committee is evaluated periodically.

20 (c) There is established within the department of [~~budget~~
21 and finance] accounting and general services a special fund to
22 be known as the shared services technology special fund to be



1 administered and expended by the chief information officer for
2 the purposes of this subsection. _____ per cent of the
3 receipts collected from special funds pursuant to section 36-27
4 shall be deposited into the shared services technology special
5 fund. Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the moneys in
6 the fund shall be used to fund the operations of the chief
7 information officer and the information technology steering
8 committee, including the employment and training of staff and
9 any other activities deemed necessary by the chief information
10 officer to carry out the purposes of this section.

11 (d) The comptroller shall account for all moneys
12 appropriated by the legislature, may raise funds to defray
13 administrative costs, and may accept donations of money and
14 personal property on behalf of the information technology
15 steering committee; provided that all donations accepted from
16 private sources shall be expended in the manner prescribed by
17 the contributor, and all moneys received from all sources shall
18 be deposited into a trust account established to hold moneys
19 received by the information technology steering committee."

20 SECTION 2. Section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:



1 "(b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the
2 director shall deposit _____ per cent of all moneys collected
3 pursuant to subsection (a) into the shared services technology
4 special fund established pursuant to section 27-43."

5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Information Technology; Shared Services Technology Special Fund

Description:

Moves the Shared Services Technology Special Fund (Fund) from the Department of Budget and Finance to the Department of Accounting and General Services. Amends amount to be deposited into the Fund. Provides for receipt and expenditure of moneys received by the information technology steering committee. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1060 HD1)

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
