
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTAIN FUNDS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding six new sections to subpart C of part V to be
3 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

4 "§304A-A Child care programs special fund. There is
5 established a child care programs special fund for the operation
6 of child care programs established under section 304A-116 and
7 the construction and renovation of child care centers
8 established by the University of Hawaii. Fees charged for child
9 care at child care programs, proceeds from donations to the
10 university for child care programs, and proceeds from loans or
11 other instruments of indebtedness for the construction or
12 renovation of child care centers shall be deposited into the
13 special fund. Expenditures from the special fund shall be made
14 for the operation of child care programs and payment of
15 principal and interest on obligations incurred for the
16 construction or renovation of child care centers.

17 §304A-B Discoveries and inventions special fund. There is
18 established a discoveries and inventions special fund into which



1 shall be deposited a portion of the total indirect overhead
2 funds generated by the university for research and training
3 purposes in the prior fiscal year, as determined by the board of
4 regents. Appropriations by the legislature subject to the
5 approval of the governor, proceeds from the commercial
6 exploitation of inventions and intellectual property developed
7 at the university, gifts, donations, fees collected, and grants
8 from public agencies and private persons may also be deposited
9 into the special fund for the purposes of supporting innovation
10 and research commercialization and the patenting, copyrighting,
11 licensing, and marketing of discoveries, inventions, and
12 technologies developed at the university. The special fund
13 shall be used to develop technologies that have potential
14 commercial value, support the administration of technology
15 transfer activities, and facilitate economic development through
16 education and research undertaken at the university.

17 **§304A-C University of Hawaii alumni special fund.** There
18 is established the University of Hawaii alumni special fund into
19 which shall be deposited funds and proceeds received by the
20 university from alumni activities and donations from alumni.
21 Funds deposited into this special fund may be expended by the
22 university for all costs associated with conducting alumni



1 affairs, activities, and programs for the university system,
2 including expenses for honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food
3 and refreshment, printing and mailing, banners and signs,
4 plaques and awards, airfare and per diem, leis, rental of
5 audiovisual, musical, and stage equipment, and activity supplies
6 and materials, without regard to statutory competitive bidding
7 requirements.

8 **§304A-D University of Hawaii at Manoa intercollegiate**
9 **athletics special fund and University of Hawaii at Hilo**
10 **intercollegiate athletics special fund.** Notwithstanding any
11 other law to the contrary, there are established the University
12 of Hawaii at Manoa intercollegiate athletics special fund and
13 the University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics
14 special fund for the intercollegiate athletic programs of the
15 University of Hawaii at Manoa and the University of Hawaii at
16 Hilo, which shall be used to receive, deposit, disburse, and
17 account for funds from the activities of the intercollegiate
18 athletic programs. The university may establish appropriate
19 charges for activities related to its athletic programs and the
20 use of its athletic facilities, the proceeds from which shall be
21 deposited into these special funds.



1 The university shall maintain the financial integrity and
2 viability of these special funds, including the maintenance of
3 an adequate reserve to cope with the various factors that impact
4 the revenue structure of an intercollegiate athletic program.

5 **§304A-E Animal research farm, Waialeale, Oahu special fund.**

6 There is established the animal research farm, Waialeale, Oahu
7 special fund for the animal research farm, Waialeale, Oahu,
8 operated by the college of tropical agriculture and human
9 resources of the University of Hawaii, into which shall be
10 deposited the receipts from fees realized from the sale of
11 livestock, services, and supplies. Funds deposited into this
12 special fund shall be expended for animal research, and services
13 and supplies related thereto.

14 **§304A-F University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre special fund.**

15 There is established the University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre
16 special fund, which shall consist of admissions, advertising
17 sales, corporate sponsorships, marketing, merchandising,
18 donations, fund-raising, fees, charges, and other moneys
19 collected in conjunction with the University of Hawaii-Hilo
20 theatre program. The special fund shall be administered by the
21 office of administrative affairs of the University of Hawaii at
22 Hilo. Funds may be expended for all costs associated with the



1 theatre program, including artists' fees, production costs,
2 personnel costs, honoraria, per diem, hotel and room rentals,
3 food and refreshments, printing and mailing, advertising,
4 airfare, leis, rental or purchase of equipment, and theater
5 supplies and materials."

6 SECTION 2. Section 304A-116, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

8 "(b) The provision of child care services may be supported
9 with proceeds from the child care programs [~~revolving~~] special
10 fund established under section [~~304A-2252~~] 304A-A, public
11 funds, and private grants and gifts to pay for the expenses of
12 operation, including payment of principal and interest on any
13 obligations incurred."

14 SECTION 3. Section 304A-2253, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15 amended as follows:

16 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:

17 "(a) There is established a University of Hawaii research
18 and training revolving fund into which shall be deposited one
19 hundred per cent of the total amount of indirect overhead
20 revenues generated by the university from research and training
21 programs. The board of regents is authorized to expend one
22 hundred per cent of the revenues deposited in the fund for:



- 1 (1) Research and training purposes that may result in
2 additional research and training grants and contracts;
3 (2) Facilitating research and training at the university;
4 and
5 (3) Further deposit into the discoveries and inventions
6 [~~revolving~~] special fund [~~and the University of Hawaii~~
7 ~~housing assistance revolving fund~~]."

8 2. By amending subsection (c) to read:

9 "(c) Notwithstanding sections 304A-107[~~7~~] and
10 [~~+~~]304A-2254[~~+~~, ~~and~~ [~~304A-2258~~]] to the contrary, the board of
11 regents or its designee, may establish a separate account within
12 the research and training revolving fund for the purpose of
13 providing advance funding to meet reimbursable costs incurred in
14 connection with federally financed research and training
15 projects. Any reimbursement received as a result of providing
16 advance funding shall be deposited into the research and
17 training revolving fund to be used for the purpose of meeting
18 reimbursable costs incurred in connection with federally
19 financed projects."

20 SECTION 4. Section 304A-2158, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

13 SECTION 18. The conversion of revolving funds to special
14 funds by repealing language in sections 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, and 14
15 of this Act and inserting new language in section 1 of this Act
16 shall in no way be construed as an authorization to remove,
17 alter, or amend any moneys from any revolving fund other than
18 for the purposes of this Act and for the allowable uses under
19 relevant law.

20 SECTION 19. In codifying the new sections added by section
21 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute



1 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
2 the new sections in this Act.

3 SECTION 20. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 21. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Converts certain revolving funds of the University of Hawaii into special funds; repeals certain funds of the University of Hawaii and transfers the remaining balances to specified alternate funds. Effective on July 1, 2030. (HB1322 HD2)
