
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR INVESTIGATION AND MITIGATION OF
DAMAGE DONE BY THE COFFEE BERRY BORER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coffee berry
2 borer, *Hypothenemus hampei*, is a small beetle native to Africa.
3 It is recognized to be the most harmful pest to coffee crops
4 worldwide, causing an estimated \$500,000,000 in losses annually.
5 The coffee industry has an economic value exceeding
6 \$70,000,000,000 each year, with over twenty million coffee-
7 farming families producing coffee in more than fifty countries.
8 The tiny, one and a half millimeter coffee berry borer
9 causes damage by boring and depositing eggs into the berry.
10 Larvae hatch and feed on the seed or bean, destroying it. The
11 beetle spends its entire larval life inside the coffee berry,
12 which encases the seed, commonly known as the coffee bean.
13 Males mate inside the berry with females, but never emerge.
14 Only mated females emerge to fly to a new berry and bore into it
15 to lay eggs and start the cycle anew. Only while outside the
16 berry are the adult female borers vulnerable to predators or
17 chemical controls.



1 The insect was native to Angola and spread to the rest of
2 Africa during the 1920s. In 1926, they were first reported in
3 the Americas, in Brazil. The beetle spread to Guatemala and
4 Mexico in the 1970s, Colombia in the late 1980s, and the
5 Dominican Republic in the 1990s. In September, 2010, the beetle
6 was discovered in Kona on the island of Hawaii.

7 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds from the
8 agricultural development and food security special fund for
9 investigation and mitigation of damage done by the coffee berry
10 borer.

11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the agricultural
12 development and food security special fund established under
13 section 141-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of \$750,000 or
14 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
15 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for
16 fiscal year 2012-2013 for investigation and mitigation of damage
17 done by the coffee berry borer in the Kona region on the island
18 of Hawaii as follows:

19 (1) \$ to fund investigative research by the
20 college of tropical agriculture and human resources of
21 the University of Hawaii, in collaboration with the
22 United States Department of Agriculture's Pacific



1 Basin Agricultural Research Center in Hilo, to develop
2 practical techniques for use to combat the effects of
3 the coffee berry borer in the Kona region on the
4 island of Hawaii;

5 (2) \$ to purchase and install equipment to
6 identify and track areas of coffee berry borer
7 infestation in the Kona region on the island of
8 Hawaii;

9 (3) \$ to provide sanitation services to mitigate
10 coffee berry borer infestations on abandoned farms and
11 other lands that contain uncultivated coffee in the
12 Kona region on the island of Hawaii;

13 (4) \$ to locate and establish a coffee berry
14 borer quarantine site with equipment and services to
15 fumigate or provide heat treatment of green coffee
16 beans for shipment from the island of Hawaii; and

17 (5) \$ to fund travel and administrative expenses
18 necessary to support the operations of the coffee
19 berry borer task force.

20 The sum appropriated in paragraph (1) shall be expended by
21 the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.



1 The sums appropriated in paragraphs (2) through (5) shall
2 be expended by the department of agriculture for the purposes of
3 this Act.

4 SECTION 3. The department of agriculture, in collaboration
5 with the coffee berry borer task force, shall submit a report to
6 the legislature no later than July 31, 2012. The report shall
7 document the expenditure of funds and the progress of activities
8 authorized by this Act.

9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
