
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES AND HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

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SECTION 1. According to the executive office on aging, the elderly population in Hawaii is one of the fastest growing in the country. Between 1990 and 2000, the number of persons aged sixty and older increased by nineteen per cent, compared to a nationwide increase of nine per cent. Studies conducted by the executive office on aging and the four county area agencies on aging have indicated that the elderly in Hawaii have a significant need for assistance in various areas and this need is outpacing the ability to provide assistance. Significant issues that arise with elderly people include health status, changes in family structure (caregivers), social security stability for the future, fear of health care burdens (financial stability), and changes in public responsibility. Case management and needs assessments of older adults are required to mold programs and services to meet the needs of the elderly community. As Hawaii's culture and values revolve around family, most caregiving of the elderly in Hawaii is provided by



1 family members, which poses financial hardships for these family
2 members. Financial stability and burden are the main issues for
3 the elderly and their caregivers and families. Long-term care
4 services are expensive and the high cost for services may lead
5 to changes in living arrangements and family households,
6 especially in Hawaii.

7 The kupuna care program was established in 1999 as a
8 collaborative effort by several agencies in Hawaii to address
9 the needs of the aging population and the issues arising from
10 those needs. The program is home- and community-based, designed
11 to address the increased need for affordable long-term care and
12 the desire to remain in the community. Kupuna care is
13 considered to be an alternative to the traditional long-term
14 care options, which include hospitals, nursing homes, adult
15 residential care homes, adult foster homes, hospice, senior
16 housing, public guardianship, and other programs administered by
17 other state offices. The goal of kupuna care is to give
18 Hawaii's elderly population access to affordable and quality
19 home- and community-based services that are client-centered and
20 family-supportive, allowing the elderly to live with
21 independence and dignity. The ten core services that are
22 offered, which are a reflection of the greatest need, are:



- 1 (1) Adult day care;
- 2 (2) Attendant care;
- 3 (3) Case management;
- 4 (4) Chore;
- 5 (5) Homemaker;
- 6 (6) Personal care;
- 7 (7) Assisted transportation;
- 8 (8) Kupuna Care transportation;
- 9 (9) Home delivered meals; and
- 10 (10) Meals for the elderly.

11 In 2008, thousands of elderly people were served by kupuna
12 care. According to the state program report for fiscal year
13 2008 as prepared by the executive office on aging, 3,277 elders
14 received meals delivered to their homes, 1,744 elders were
15 served by case managers, 874 elders used personal care, and 597
16 elders used the homemaker services. Kupuna care fills an
17 important gap in assistance for the elderly in Hawaii and cuts
18 in service would be detrimental to their ability to live with
19 independence and dignity.

20 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,500,000 or so much
22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the



1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
2 2012-2013 to provide additional funding for the kupuna care
3 program. This funding shall be in addition to the \$4,854,350
4 executive office on aging base budget.

5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
6 of health for the purposes of this part.

7 **PART II**

8 SECTION 3. The legislature finds that the national and
9 global economic crisis that began in the second half of 2008 has
10 caused significant economic problems in numerous industries in
11 the State, including the airline, cruise ship, tourist, and
12 construction industries. Mass layoffs have been reported by an
13 increasing number of Hawaii businesses statewide, from the
14 agricultural sector to the medical-services sector. Difficult
15 economic times and declining tax revenues have resulted in
16 budget cuts for all state services.

17 The current and impending situation jeopardizes the safety
18 net of basic human services, health, and education needs for
19 Hawaii's residents and families. While all of Hawaii's
20 residents will be affected by the situation, gap group families
21 and families closest to the poverty line will suffer the most.



1 Pursuant to Act 304, Session Laws of Hawaii 1999, the
2 legislature established the emergency and budget reserve fund,
3 which is codified in section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as
4 a temporary supplemental source of funding for the State of
5 Hawaii in times of emergency, economic downturn, or unforeseen
6 reduction in revenues. As set forth in section 328L-3, Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes, specific purposes for the fund include
8 maintaining levels of programs determined to be essential to
9 public health, safety, welfare, and education. Section 328L-3,
10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, also includes certain prohibitions on
11 appropriations from the emergency and budget reserve fund.
12 Appropriations for the following purposes are specifically
13 prohibited:

- 14 (1) To meet expenses of the legislature;
- 15 (2) To provide for salary adjustments for officials
16 appointed pursuant to article V, section 6; or article
17 VI, section 3, of the Hawaii State Constitution and
18 for others whose salaries are directly related to
19 salaries of these officials; and
- 20 (3) To fund cost items in any collective bargaining
21 contract.



1 The legislature finds that expenditures from the emergency
2 and budget reserve fund are needed to meet the conditions of
3 emergency, economic downturn, and unforeseen reduction in
4 revenues that the State currently faces. Further, the
5 legislature finds that the appropriations in this part are
6 consistent with the purposes of the emergency and budget reserve
7 fund.

8 The purpose of this part is to appropriate moneys from the
9 emergency and budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii to
10 maintain the levels of programs determined to be essential to
11 education, public health, and public welfare.

12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
13 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000
14 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
15 for respite services.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17 health for the purposes of this part.

18 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
19 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000
20 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
21 to supplement the healthy start program.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 health for the purposes of this part.

3 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
4 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000
5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
6 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes, to Waikiki community center.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
9 health for the purposes of this part.

10 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
11 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000
12 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
13 for the kupuna care program.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
15 health for the purposes of this part.

16 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
17 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000
18 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
19 for the aging and disability resource center.

20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
21 health for the purposes of this part.



1 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
2 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000
3 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
4 for the developmental disabilities medicaid waiver program.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
6 health for the purposes of this part.

7 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
8 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000
9 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
10 for mental health services.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
12 health for the purposes of this part.

13 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
14 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000
15 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
16 for the partnerships in community living program.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18 health for the purposes of this part.

19 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
20 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,400,000
21 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
22 for substance abuse treatment.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 health for the purposes of this part.

3 *SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
4 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$125,000
5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
6 for the healthy aging partnerships program.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 health for the purposes of this part.

9 SECTION 14. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
10 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$332,000
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
12 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
13 Revised Statutes, to the Waianae District Comprehensive Health
14 and Hospital Board, Inc., to support its emergency room
15 services.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17 health for the purposes of this part.

18 SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
19 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$270,000
20 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
21 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii



1 Revised Statutes, for HIV/AIDS related services and to be
2 distributed as follows:

3	(1) Life Foundation	\$90,000
4	(2) Gregory House Programs	\$90,000
5	(3) Community Health Outreach Work	
6	Project to Prevent AIDS	\$90,000

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 health for the purposes of this part.

9 SECTION 16. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
10 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
12 to fund the housing first pilot program, through a collaboration
13 between the Hawaii public housing authority and the department
14 of human services, for chronically homeless individuals,
15 including those who have an addiction or mental illness, or
16 both.

17 The Hawaii public housing authority, in collaboration with
18 the department of human services shall prepare a report to the
19 legislature on the progress of the housing first pilot program.
20 The Hawaii public housing authority shall submit the report to
21 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
22 of the regular session of 2012.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 human services for the purposes of this part.

3 SECTION 17. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
4 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000
5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
6 for meals for the elderly for kupuna care.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 health's executive office on aging for the purposes of this
9 part.

10 SECTION 18. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
11 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000
12 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
13 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
14 Revised Statutes, to Kokua Kalihi Valley (Comprehensive Family
15 Services).

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17 health for the purposes of this part.

18 SECTION 19. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
19 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$180,000
20 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
21 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii



1 Revised Statutes, to The Path Clinic for services to pregnant
2 women struggling with addiction.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
4 health for the purposes of this part.

5 SECTION 20. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
6 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$400,000
7 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
8 for the baby S.A.F.E. (substance abuse free environment)
9 program.

10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
11 health for the purposes of this part.

12 SECTION 21. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
13 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$170,000
14 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
15 for fetal alcohol spectrum disorders.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17 health for the purposes of this part.

18 SECTION 22. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
19 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000
20 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
21 for family planning.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 health for the purposes of this part.

3 SECTION 23. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
4 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$600,000
5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
6 for perinatal health programs.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 health for the purposes of this part.

9 SECTION 24. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
10 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$400,000
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
12 for the preschool developmental screening program.

13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14 health for the purposes of this part.

15 SECTION 25. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
16 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000
17 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
18 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
19 Revised Statutes, to the Blueprint for Change for neighborhood
20 place walk-in centers.

21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
22 human services for the purposes of this part.



1 SECTION 26. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
 2 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$550,000
 3 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
 4 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
 5 Revised Statutes, to the Hawaii Primary Care Association for the
 6 Hawaii immigrant health initiative program provided at federally
 7 qualified health centers.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 9 human services for the purposes of this part.

10 SECTION 27. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
 11 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,578,500
 12 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
 13 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
 14 Revised Statutes, to support domestic violence shelters
 15 statewide and to be distributed as follows:

- 16 (1) Child and Family Service
- 17 (A) Two shelters on Oahu \$206,429
- 18 (B) Two shelters on Big Island \$206,429
- 19 (2) Parents and Children Together \$103,214
- 20 (3) Women Helping Women \$103,214
- 21 (4) Molokai Community Service Council, Inc. \$40,000
- 22 (5) Young Women's Christian



1	Association (YWCA) of Kauai	\$103,214
2	(6) Windward Spouse Abuse Shelter	\$200,000

4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
5 human services for the purposes of this part.

6 SECTION 28. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
7 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$210,000
8 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
9 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
10 Revised Statutes, to Hale Mahaolu for personal care services.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
12 human services for the purposes of this part.

13 SECTION 29. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
14 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000
15 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
16 for the shelter plus care program.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
18 human services for the purposes of this part.

19 SECTION 30. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
20 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000
21 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
22 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii



1 Revised Statutes, to Hawaii Primary Care Association for health
2 care services for uninsured persons.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
4 human services for the purposes of this part.

5 SECTION 31. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
6 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,900,000
7 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
8 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
9 Revised Statutes, to the Hawaii Primary Care Association for
10 adult dental care provided at federally qualified health
11 centers; provided that the funds shall not be used for any other
12 purpose. The governor is authorized to utilize enhanced federal
13 medical assistance percentages funds to offset the amount
14 appropriated; provided that the total amount shall not exceed
15 \$1,900,000. The department of human services shall prepare a
16 report on:

- 17 (1) The number of adults receiving these benefits;
18 (2) The cost per person;
19 (3) Total breakdown of administrative costs and other
20 overhead costs; and



1 (4) Statistics, if available, on how this dental program
2 is reducing the number of emergency dental-related
3 medical procedures;

4 provided further that the department of human services shall
5 submit its report to the legislature no later than twenty days
6 prior to the convening of the 2012 regular session.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 human services for the purposes of this part.

9 SECTION 32. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
10 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
12 for the Maui community college, University of Hawaii, for the
13 adult dental care program.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
15 human services for the purposes of this part.

16 SECTION 33. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
17 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000
18 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
19 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
20 Revised Statutes, to the Hawaii Primary Care Association for
21 outstationed eligibility worker services provided at federally
22 qualified health centers.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 human services for the purposes of this part.

3 SECTION 34. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
4 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$80,000 or
5 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to
6 provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes, to the Hawaii Primary Care Association for
8 outreach services provided at federally qualified health
9 centers.

10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
11 human services for the purposes of this part.

12 SECTION 35. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
13 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$44,636 or
14 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to
15 provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
16 Revised Statutes, to the Hawaii Primary Care Association for
17 outreach services to locate uninsured children provided at
18 federally qualified health centers.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
20 human services for the purposes of this part.

21 SECTION 36. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
22 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$800,000



1 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
2 for child care subsidies.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
4 human services for the purposes of this part.

5 SECTION 37. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
6 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000
7 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
8 for the general assistance program under section 346-71, Hawaii
9 Revised Statutes, to maintain the general assistance benefit
10 amount at \$450 per person per month or as close to \$450 per
11 person per month as possible, given the monthly caseload.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13 human services for the purposes of this part.

14 SECTION 38. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
15 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000
16 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
17 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
18 Revised Statutes, to Adult Friends for Youth for youth gang
19 prevention and intervention services.

20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
21 human services for the purposes of this part.



1 SECTION 39. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
2 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$447,750
3 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
4 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
5 Revised Statutes, to Hawaii Centers for Independent Living for
6 statewide independent living services.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 human services for the purposes of this part.

9 SECTION 40. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
10 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
12 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
13 Revised Statutes, to the Susannah Wesley Community Center for
14 the Susannah Wesley Community Center Youth Service Center.

15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
16 human services for the purposes of this part.

17 SECTION 41. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
18 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$37,500 or
19 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to
20 provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
21 Revised Statutes, to Planned Parenthood of Hawaii for statewide
22 sexual health education.



1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2 human services for the purposes of this part.

3 SECTION 42. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
4 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000
5 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
6 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
7 Revised Statutes, to the Partners in Development Foundation to
8 provide comprehensive family training and transitional services
9 to homeless families on the leeward coast of Oahu and for the
10 Tutu and Me Traveling Preschool.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
12 human services for the purposes of this part.

13 SECTION 43. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
14 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,200,000
15 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
16 for the preschool open doors program.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
18 of human services for the purposes of this part.

19 SECTION 44. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
20 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000
21 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012



1 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
2 Revised Statutes, to Oahu About Face Family of Programs.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
4 human services for the purposes of this part.

5 SECTION 45. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
6 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000
7 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
8 for domestic violence services.

9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
10 the purposes of this part.

11 SECTION 46. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
12 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000
13 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
14 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
15 Revised Statutes, to Volunteer Legal Services Hawaii to provide
16 pro bono legal services for indigent persons.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
18 the purposes of this part.

19 SECTION 47. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
20 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$720,000
21 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
22 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii



1 Revised Statutes, to the Legal Aid Society of Hawaii to provide
2 general civil legal services.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
4 the purposes of this part.

5 SECTION 48. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
6 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$282,000
7 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
8 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
9 Revised Statutes, for the Hawaii Family Law Clinic to provide
10 services to obtain temporary restraining orders.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
12 the purposes of this part.

13 SECTION 49. There is appropriated out of the emergency and
14 budget reserve fund of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000
15 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012
16 to provide funding for grants pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii
17 Revised Statutes, to the Catholic Charities Hawaii to provide
18 intra-familial sex assault services.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
20 the purposes of this part.
