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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MANDATORY ETHICS TRAINING.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 84-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]§84-41[+] Applicability of part. This part applies to  
4 legislators[~~, elected~~]; members of the board of education[~~;~~];  
5 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs[~~;~~]; the governor[~~;~~];  
6 the lieutenant governor[ ~~and~~]; executive department heads and  
7 deputies[~~;~~]; the administrative director of the State; the  
8 president, vice presidents, assistant vice presidents,  
9 chancellors, and provosts of the University of Hawaii; the  
10 superintendent, deputy superintendent, state librarian, and  
11 special assistant to the state librarian of the department of  
12 education; the administrative director and deputy administrative  
13 director of the courts; and the administrator and assistant  
14 administrator of the office of Hawaiian affairs. This part does  
15 not apply to any other officer or employee of the State."

16 SECTION 2. Section 84-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
17 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:



1           "(d) [~~The ethics training course shall be held in January~~  
2 ~~of each year for those who have not attended the course~~  
3 ~~previously.]~~ The course shall last [~~at least~~] no more than two  
4 hours in length. Those state officials and employees enumerated  
5 in section 84-41, who have not previously attended the ethics  
6 training course, shall complete the course within sixty days of  
7 their election or appointment to state office. The state ethics  
8 commission may grant an extension of time to complete the course  
9 for good cause shown."

10           SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12           SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2059.
