
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF CLOSED PRIMARIES CONDUCTED BY OTHER STATES AND THE CORRESPONDING EFFECT ON VOTER TURNOUT.

1 WHEREAS, the various states are free to conduct primary
2 elections however the respective state deems appropriate, as
3 long as individuals' constitutional rights are protected; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Hawaii conducts open primaries where a voter may
6 choose which primary to vote in without being required to
7 register with a political party; and
8

9 WHEREAS, in *California Democratic Party v. Jones*, 530 U.S.
10 567 (2000), the United States Supreme Court ruled that a
11 political party has a right, guaranteed by the First Amendment
12 of the United States Constitution, to limit participation in its
13 primary elections to persons who are members of that political
14 party; and
15

16 WHEREAS, currently, eleven states conduct closed primary
17 elections that require a voter to be a registered member of the
18 political party holding the primary; and
19

20 WHEREAS, the State has a compelling interest in increasing
21 voter participation in primary elections to ensure a
22 representative form of government; and
23

24 WHEREAS, it is unclear whether open or closed primary
25 elections result in a higher voter turnout in those
26 jurisdictions; now, therefore,

28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
29 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
30 of 2011, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to
31 conduct a study to determine the types of closed primary
32 elections conducted by other states and the corresponding
33 effect, if any, on voter turnout in those jurisdictions; and


