
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REQUIRE COUNSELING FOR ANYONE INVOLVED WITH BULLYING IN SCHOOL AND POSSIBLE EXPULSION FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY THEREWITH.

1 WHEREAS, there is a growing body of research on the
2 prevalence of school bullying, the likelihood of school bullies
3 developing antisocial behavior, and the effects of bullying on
4 student victims; and

6 WHEREAS, a 2002 United States Secret Service report found
7 that bullying played a major role in several school shootings on
8 the mainland; and

9
10 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, three newspaper articles in *The*
11 *Honolulu Advertiser*, dated February 5, June 28, and
12 September 26, 2006, highlighted the problem of bullying in
13 Hawaii's public schools; and

15 WHEREAS, bullying continues to be a problem in Hawaii's
16 schools; and

18 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that counseling is an
19 effective and common sense approach to addressing the issue of
20 bullying in school; now, therefore,

22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
23 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
24 of 2011, that the Department of Education is requested to
25 require counseling for anyone who engages in bullying and to
26 consider expulsion for those who do not comply with counseling
27 requirements; and



