HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO RECONSIDER ITS PRACTICE OF REMOVING TREES WITH HISTORIC VALUE.

1 WHEREAS, a nearly one-hundred year old comose fig tree 2 growing on the grounds of the University of Hawaii at Manoa was 3 recently cut down and removed in preparation for a planned 4 expansion of the Campus Center; and

6 WHEREAS, the comose fig tree was planted there as part of 7 the heritage collection of trees planted on the Manoa campus by 8 Joseph Rock, the Territory's first botanist and the university's 9 first botany professor; and

11 WHEREAS, the comose fig tree was one of only a few of its 12 species in the entire State and has been called part of 13 University of Hawaii at Manoa's living history; and 14

WHEREAS, the original construction plans for the Campus
Center expansion accommodated the continued existence of the
comose fig tree, but were later revised to require its removal;
and

20 WHEREAS, the planned expansion merely involves recreational 21 and not educational or research facilities; now, therefore, 22

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that the University of Hawaii is requested to refrain from removing trees with historic value, by designing new and expanded buildings in a way that will permit preservation of these trees; and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 32 Regents of the University of Hawaii and the President of the 33 University of Hawaii.
