# HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM THE SECOND WEEK OF AUGUST AS  
"NATIONAL ASSISTANCE DOG WEEK".

1           WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has 227,000 citizens with  
2 disabilities; and

4           WHEREAS, those citizens who need a service dog wait  
5 approximately three to five years for a service dog; and

7           WHEREAS, assistance dogs, including service dogs, guide  
8 dogs, hearing alert dogs and alert/seizure response dogs,  
9 transform the lives of their human partners with physical and  
10 mental disabilities; and

12           WHEREAS, assistance dogs serve as devoted companions,  
13 helpers, aides, best friends and close family members; and

15           WHEREAS, recognizing these dogs, who benefit Hawaii's  
16 citizens with disabilities, will aid in raising awareness and  
17 educate the public about how these specially trained animals are  
18 aiding so many people in Hawaii and could benefit so many more  
19 of Hawaii's citizens; now, therefore,

21           BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
22 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
23 of 2011, that the Governor is requested to express the State's  
24 support for the contributions of assistance dogs to Hawaii's  
25 citizens with disabilities by proclaiming the second week of  
26 August of every year, beginning on the second week of August  
27 2011 as "Hawaii State Assistance Dogs Week" in the State of  
28 Hawaii; and

2 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of Hawaii and the  
3 Hawaii Humane Society.
