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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF AGING.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 349-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:  
3           "(b) The head of this office shall be known as the  
4 director of the executive office on aging, hereinafter referred  
5 to as director[-], who shall be a deputy director of the  
6 department of health. The director shall have professional  
7 training in the field of social work, education, public health,  
8 and other related fields; extensive direct experience in  
9 programs or services related to elders; and recent experience in  
10 a supervisory, consultative, or administrative position. The  
11 director shall be nominated and appointed by the governor  
12 without regard to chapters 76 and 89. [~~Effective July 1, 2005,~~  
13 ~~the director shall be paid a salary set by the appointing~~  
14 ~~authority that shall not exceed sixty nine per cent of the~~  
15 ~~salary of the director of human resources development.] The  
16 director shall be included in any benefit program generally  
17 applicable to the officers and employees of the State."~~

3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
