
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that advanced practice
2 registered nurses are qualified and competent practitioners.
3 The department of commerce and consumer affairs requires
4 advanced practice registered nurses to pay multiple fees for
5 deposit into the compliance resolution fund. However, the
6 department does not require members of other professions under
7 its authority to pay comparable multiple fees into the
8 compliance resolution fund. An advanced practice registered
9 nurse is currently required to pay fees for initial issuance and
10 each renewal of a license as a registered nurse, initial
11 issuance and each renewal of a license as an advanced practice
12 registered nurse, and initial issuance and each renewal of a
13 certificate of prescriptive authority as an advanced practice
14 registered nurse.

15 These multiple fees create unnecessary barriers to advanced
16 practice registered nurses' licensure and practice. The
17 department of commerce and consumer affairs has not provided
18 justification for assessing advanced practice registered nurses



1 in this manner. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to
2 eliminate excessive fees for advanced practice registered
3 nurses.

4 SECTION 2. Section 457-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

6 "(a) Effective October 1, 2009, the board shall grant
7 recognition as an advanced practice registered nurse to a nurse
8 who has:

- 9 (1) A current, unencumbered license as a registered nurse
10 in this State;
- 11 (2) An unencumbered license as a registered nurse in all
12 other states in which the nurse has a current and
13 active license;
- 14 (3) An unencumbered recognition as an advanced practice
15 registered nurse or similar designation in all other
16 states in which the nurse has a current and active
17 recognition as an advanced practice registered nurse;
- 18 (4) Completed an accredited graduate-level education
19 program leading to a master's degree as a certified
20 registered nurse anesthetist, a nurse midwife, a
21 clinical nurse specialist, or a nurse practitioner;



- 1 (5) A current, unencumbered certification of having passed
2 a national certification examination that measures
3 role and population-focused competencies and is
4 recognized by the board;
- 5 (6) Maintained continued competencies through
6 recertification in role and population-focused
7 competencies through a national certification program
8 recognized by the board;
- 9 (7) Acquired advanced clinical knowledge and skills
10 preparing the nurse to provide direct care to patients
11 through a significant educational and practical
12 concentration on the direct care of patients;
- 13 (8) Demonstrated a greater breadth of knowledge, a greater
14 synthesis of data, greater complexity of skills and
15 interventions, and greater role autonomy than
16 demonstrated by a registered nurse;
- 17 (9) Been educationally prepared to assume responsibility
18 and accountability for health promotion and
19 maintenance and to assess, diagnose, and manage
20 patient problems through the use and prescription of
21 pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic interventions;



- 1 (10) Acquired clinical experience of sufficient depth and
2 breadth to reflect the intended license; and
- 3 (11) Paid the [~~appropriate~~] fees[-] that are authorized
4 under section 457-7 for registered nurses and the
5 center for nursing fee established by section 3 of Act
6 198, Session Laws of Hawaii 2003."

7 SECTION 3. Section 457-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 **"§457-8.6 Prescriptive authority for advanced practice**
10 **registered nurses.** (a) The board shall grant prescriptive
11 authority to qualified advanced practice registered nurses and
12 shall designate the requirements for advanced nursing practice
13 related to prescriptive authority. The board shall determine
14 the exclusionary formulary for qualified advanced practice
15 registered nurses who are granted prescriptive authority.

16 (b) The department of commerce and consumer affairs shall
17 establish a joint formulary advisory committee composed of:

- 18 (1) Two persons licensed as advanced practice registered
19 nurses and appointed by the board;
- 20 (2) Two persons licensed in medicine by the Hawaii medical
21 board and appointed by the Hawaii medical board;



1 (3) Three persons licensed as pharmacists and appointed by
2 the board of pharmacy;

3 (4) One representative of the University of Hawaii John A.
4 Burns school of medicine appointed by the dean of the
5 University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine;
6 and

7 (5) One representative from a school of nursing with an
8 advanced practice registered nurse program.

9 The joint formulary advisory committee shall recommend the
10 applicable formulary for persons recognized under this section.

11 The board shall consider the recommendations of the joint
12 formulary advisory committee in adopting the formulary. The
13 appropriate working relationship with licensed physicians shall
14 be reflected in rules adopted by the board in accordance with
15 chapter 91.

16 (c) The board shall establish nursing requirements for
17 education, experience, and national certification pursuant to
18 rules adopted in accordance with chapter 91.

19 (d) Advanced practice registered nurses shall be
20 considered qualified if they have met the requirements of
21 section 457-8.5(a), and have met the advanced pharmacology
22 requirements for initial prescriptive authority pursuant to



1 rules adopted by the board. Only qualified advanced practice
2 registered nurses authorized to diagnose, prescribe, and
3 institute therapy or referrals of patients to health care
4 agencies, health care providers, and community resources and,
5 only as appropriate, to the practice specialty in which the
6 advanced practice registered nurse is qualified, may:

7 (1) Prescribe and administer over the counter and legend
8 drugs, and controlled substances pursuant to this
9 chapter and to chapter 329; provided that an advanced
10 practice registered nurse shall not request, receive,
11 or sign for professional controlled substance samples;

12 (2) Prescribe, order, and dispense medical devices and
13 equipment; and

14 (3) Plan and initiate a therapeutic regimen that includes
15 nutritional, diagnostic, and supportive services
16 including home health care, hospice, and physical and
17 occupational therapy.

18 (e) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, no advanced
19 practice registered nurse shall be required to pay a fee
20 relating to the grant of prescriptive authority."

21 SECTION 4. Section 457-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:



1 "(a) The license of every person licensed, recognized, or
2 granted prescriptive authority shall expire on June 30 of every
3 odd-numbered year and shall be renewed biennially, except as
4 provided in this section. Biennially in each odd-numbered year,
5 the board shall make available an application for renewal of
6 license before the deadline set forth by the board to every
7 person to whom a license was issued or renewed during the
8 biennium. The applicant shall complete the application and
9 submit it to the board with a renewal fee, if applicable, and
10 all required documents on or before the deadline set by the
11 board. The applicant shall provide documents from proper
12 agencies or parties of any criminal conviction or any
13 disciplinary action taken or pending in this State or any other
14 state in the United States or any territory or possession under
15 the jurisdiction of the United States within the two years prior
16 to application for renewal of license. As part of the license
17 renewal process, each applicant shall be required to complete a
18 survey developed by the Hawaii state center for nursing as
19 deemed necessary by the Hawaii state center for nursing. Upon
20 receipt of the application and fee, if applicable, the board
21 shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue to the
22 applicant a certificate of renewal for the biennium expiring two



1 years hence on the deadline set by the board. The renewal shall
2 render the holder thereof a legal practitioner of nursing for
3 the period stated on the renewal form."

4 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
