# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HONOR AND REMEMBER FLAG.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. While war deaths have been a part of the United  
2 States' heritage since its birth, the State of Hawaii has not  
3 instituted an official symbol commemorating fallen  
4 servicepersons. House Resolution 1034 of the 111<sup>th</sup> Congress  
5 designates the Honor and Remember Flag, created by Honor and  
6 Remember, Inc., to officially recognize and honor fallen members  
7 of the armed forces.

8           The purpose of this Act is to designate the Honor and  
9 Remember Flag as a symbol for the State of Hawaii to officially  
10 recognize and honor fallen members of the armed forces. The  
11 Honor and Remember Flag red field represents the brave men and  
12 women who sacrificed their lives for freedom. The blue star is  
13 a symbol of active service in military conflict that dates back  
14 to World War I. The white border recognizes the purity of the  
15 sacrifice. The Honor and Remember Flag gold star signifies the  
16 ultimate sacrifice of a warrior in active service who is not  
17 returning home and reflects the value of the life given. The



1 Honor and Remember Flag flame symbolizes the eternal spirit of  
2 the departed.

3 SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended  
4 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to  
5 read as follows:

6 "§5 Honor and remember flag. The honor and remember  
7 flag is adopted, established, and designated as the State's  
8 emblem of service and sacrifice by the brave men and women of  
9 the United States Armed Forces who have given their lives in the  
10 line of duty."

11 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
