
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COST
ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended for immediate passage
3 in accordance with section 9 of Article VII of the Constitution
4 of the State of Hawaii.

5 SECTION 2. There are appropriated or authorized from the
6 sources of funding indicated below to health premium payments
7 (BUF 761) the following sums, or so much thereof as may be
8 necessary, to fund for fiscal biennium 2009-2011 the Hawaii
9 employer-union health benefits trust fund costs contained in the
10 agreement negotiated with the exclusive bargaining
11 representative of collective bargaining units 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6,
12 7, 8, 9, 10, and 13:

15 Of the above listed amounts, the following amounts are for

1 SECTION 3. Funds appropriated or authorized by this part

3 state agencies for expenditure in the respective fiscal year for

8 (BUF 761) the following sums, or so much thereof as may be
9 necessary, to fund for fiscal biennium 2009-2011 the Hawaii

11 chapter 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for state officers and
12 employees excluded from collective bargaining who belong to the
13 same compensation plans as those officers and employees within
14 collective bargaining units 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and
15 13:

Emergency Appropriations for Collective Bargaining Cost Items

Description:

To provide Employer contributions amounts for plan year 2010-2011 for Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund health benefit plan premiums for the employees of collective bargaining units 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 13 and their excluded counterparts beginning March 2011.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Budget and Finance

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING EMERGENCY
APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING
COST ITEMS.

PURPOSE: To provide fund authorizations and
appropriations for collective bargaining
cost fund for fiscal biennium 2009-2011 the
Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust
fund costs in the agreement negotiated with
the exclusive bargaining representative of
collective bargaining units 1, 2, 3, 4, 5,
6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 13 and their excluded
counterparts beginning March 2011.

MEANS: By the submittal of a specific appropriation
measure.

JUSTIFICATION: Funding emergency appropriations by the
legislature are necessary to cover the cost
of implementing the collective bargaining
agreement recently negotiated between the
State and the respective bargaining units
representing State public officers and
employees for Hawaii employer-union health
benefits trust premium contributions for
plan year 2010-2011.

Inasmuch as an agreement with the bargaining
unit was not in time to include the cost
items in the 2011-2013 biennium budget, a
separate measure is proposed for submittal
to the legislature.

Impact on the public: "(I)t is the public
policy of the State to promote harmonious
and cooperative relations between government
and its employees and to protect the public
by assuring effective and orderly operations
of government. These policies are best
effectuated by (1) recognizing the right of
public employees to organize for the purpose
of collective bargaining, (2) requiring the

public employers to negotiate with and enter into written agreements with exclusive representatives on matters of wages, hours, and other conditions of employment, while, at the same time, (3) maintaining merit principles and the principle of equal pay for equal work among state and county employees . . ." (Section 89-1, HRS).

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Pay raise and other negotiated cost items are not included in the departments' operating budget request.
