

H.B. NO. 1060

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 **§27-43 Information technology; chief information officer;**
4 **information technology steering committee; establishment;**
5 **responsibilities.** (a) There is established within the office
6 of the governor a full-time chief information officer to
7 organize, manage, and oversee statewide information technology
8 governance[, ~~including supervision and oversight of the~~
9 ~~information and communication services division of the~~
10 ~~department of accounting and general services~~]. The chief
11 information officer shall be appointed by the governor as
12 provided in section 26-34. The chief information officer shall
13 report directly to the governor and, in conjunction with the
14 information technology steering committee, shall:

15 (1) Develop, implement, and manage statewide information
16 technology governance;

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1 (2) Develop, implement, and manage the state information
2 technology strategic plans;

3 (3) Develop and implement statewide technology standards;

4 (4) Report annually to the governor and the legislature on
5 the status and implementation of the state information
6 technology strategic plan; and

7 (5) Perform other necessary or desirable functions to
8 facilitate the intent of this section.

9 (b) There is established an information technology
10 steering committee to assist the chief information officer in
11 developing the State's information technology standards and
12 policies, including but not limited to:

13 (1) Assisting the chief information officer in developing
14 and implementing the state information technology strategic
15 plans;

16 (2) Assessing executive branch departments' progress in
17 meeting the objectives defined in the state information
18 technology strategic plans and identifying best practices for
19 shared or consolidated services;

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1 (3) Ensuring technology projects are selected based on
2 their potential impact and risk to the State, as well as their
3 strategic value;

4 (4) Ensuring that executive branch departments maintain
5 sufficient tools to assess the value and benefits of technology
6 initiatives;

7 (5) Assisting the chief information officer in developing
8 state information technology standards and policies; and

9 (6) Clarifying the roles, responsibilities, and authority
10 of the information and communication services division,
11 specifically as it relates to its statewide duties.

12 The members of the information technology steering
13 committee shall be appointed by the senate president and speaker
14 of the house of representatives in equal number respectively and
15 shall include representatives from executive branch departments,
16 including large user agencies such as the department of
17 education and the University of Hawaii; the judiciary; the
18 legislature; and private individuals. The chief information
19 officer shall serve as the chair of the committee and shall
20 ensure that the committee is evaluated periodically.

1 (c) There is established within the department of budget
2 and finance a special fund to be known as the shared services
3 technology special fund to be administered and expended by the
4 chief information officer for the purposes of this subsection.
5 [~~per cent of the receipts collected~~] The amount of
6 \$1,000,000 from special funds pursuant to section 36-27 shall be
7 deposited into the shared services technology special fund. Any
8 law to the contrary notwithstanding, the moneys in the fund
9 shall be used to fund the operations of the chief information
10 officer and the information technology steering committee,
11 including the employment and training of staff and any other
12 activities deemed necessary by the chief information officer to
13 carry out the purposes of this section.

14 (d) The director of the department of budget and finance
15 shall account for all moneys appropriated by the legislature,
16 may raise funds to defray administrative costs, and may accept
17 donations of money and personal property on behalf of the
18 information technology committee; provided that all donations
19 accepted from private sources shall be expended in the manner
20 prescribed by the contributor, and all moneys received from all

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1 sources shall be deposited into the information technology
2 steering committee trust account.

3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011
6 provided further that section 27-43 shall be repealed in its
7 entirety on June 30, 2013.

Information Technology; Chief Information Officer; Fund

Description:

Specifies a funding amount for the Shared Services Special Fund, establishes a Trust Fund, removes CIO oversight of the information and communication division, and adds a sunset date.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Accounting and General Services

TITLE: RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

PURPOSE: Transfers funds into the Shared Services Special Fund, establishes the Information Technology Steering Committee Trust Account, removes chief information officer's (CIO) oversight of the information and communication services division in the department of accounting and general services, and sunsets this bill on June 30, 2013.

MEANS: Amend Hawaii Revised Statutes 27-43.

JUSTIFICATION: Act 200, SLH 2010 created the CIO position and outlined the basic responsibilities of the position. Funds have been transferred into the special fund to carry out this the provisions in this bill. A trust fund has been established for the receipt of grants and donations to supplement funding. The development of a strategic plan will become the basis of the long term organizational structure for the CIO and required funding to implement the Plan. The revision represents the interim step required by the CIO to complete the Plan.

Impact on the public: Improve service to the public by leveraging technology to increase employee efficiency and reduce service times.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Leveraging technology through the utilization of a centralized information system(s) will increase employee efficiency and improve service delivery to the public. It will also enhance communication between departments through interactive computer systems versus the current silo approach. The long term approach will also establish

an organizational structure which maximizes the technology gains.
