14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, the San Francisco consulate's visits and contact with Mexican nationals living in Hawaii is limited due to Hawaii's distance from the United States mainland and funds available for travel; and
19 20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, the lack of accessibility to the Mexican Consulate in San Francisco results in unmet needs of Mexican nationals in Hawaii, such as the expiration of, and inability to obtain, required documents and difficulty addressing abusive treatment and rights violations; now, therefore,
24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Secretary of Foreign Affairs of the United Mexican States, is requested to consider establishing a permanent Mexican Consulate in the State of Hawaii to improve consular presence and address the needs of Mexican nationals living in Hawaii; and
