
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS AND
THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND
TOURISM TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's 25,000 small businesses generate over
2 \$2.9 billion in revenue and provide innovative products and
3 services; and
4

5 WHEREAS, it is estimated that small businesses provide
6 between 80 to 90 percent of the jobs in Hawaii; and
7

8 WHEREAS, small businesses face numerous challenges in
9 Hawaii, including the high cost of land and labor, high taxes,
10 and the lack of economies of scale; and
11

12 WHEREAS, workers' compensation is a significant labor
13 expense for both large and small employers in Hawaii; and
14

15 WHEREAS, small businesses are reported to face inequities
16 in comparison to large businesses regarding workers'-
17 compensation costs; now, therefore,

19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
20 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
21 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Labor and
22 Industrial Relations and the Department of Business, Economic
23 Development, and Tourism are requested to conduct a study
24 concerning any inequities in workers'-compensation costs between
25 small and large businesses; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Labor and
28 Industrial Relations and the Department of Business, Economic
29 Development, and Tourism jointly submit a report of their





1 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
2 legislation, to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to
3 the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and

7 of Labor and Industrial Relations; and Director of Business,
8 Economic Development, and Tourism.
