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# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO ESTABLISH A GAMING TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL IMPACTS OF ALLOWING GAMING AND ESTABLISHING CASINO OPERATIONS ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

1           WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is exploring  
2 options to establish a consistent and sustainable cash flow to  
3 financially support its programs; and  
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5           WHEREAS, many destinations that are competing with Hawaii  
6 for visitor dollars have legal gaming in some form; and  
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8           WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of only two states that prohibit all  
9 types of gaming; and  
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11           WHEREAS, those opposed to legal gaming argue that these  
12 forms of gaming will not attract new dollars from outside  
13 Hawaii, but instead will cause a shift in spending patterns,  
14 which will ultimately be detrimental to local residents; and  
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16           WHEREAS, on the other hand, proponents of gaming argue that  
17 the State loses millions in revenue each year to other  
18 jurisdictions that allow gaming; now, therefore,  
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20           BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
21 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
22 of 2011, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Hawaiian  
23 Home Lands is requested to establish a Gaming Task Force to  
24 study the advantages and disadvantages, including but not  
25 limited to economic and social impacts, of allowing gaming and  
26 establishing casino operations on Hawaiian home lands; and  
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28           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to  
29 include the following members:  
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- 1 (1) The Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission or
- 2 the Chairperson's designee;
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- 4 (2) The Director of Business, Economic Development, and
- 5 Tourism or the Director's designee;
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- 7 (3) The Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs or the
- 8 Director's designee;
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- 10 (4) The Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the
- 11 Hawaiian Tourism Authority or the Chairperson's
- 12 designee; and
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- 14 (5) The Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the
- 15 Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau or the
- 16 Chairperson's designee; and
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18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Task Force  
 19 shall select a chairperson from among themselves; and

20  
 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to  
 22 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including  
 23 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than  
 24 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of  
 25 2012; and

 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the  
 29 Hawaiian Homes Commission; Director of Business, Economic  
 30 Development, and Tourism; Director of Commerce and Consumer  
 31 Affairs; Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Hawaiian  
 32 Tourism Authority; and Chairperson of the Board of Directors of  
 33 the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau.
