## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO WORK COLLABORATIVELY TO FIND WAYS TO MORE EFFECTIVELY ENFORCE THE STATE'S CIVIL AND CRIMINAL LAWS THAT MAY APPLY TO UNLICENSED CONTRACTORS.

WHEREAS, unlicensed contractors often do not possess the 1 2 necessary training and experience to obtain a license and rarely 3 maintain workers' compensation and liability insurance; and 4 5 WHEREAS, many unlicensed contractors receive or pay wages 6 in cash, thereby avoiding unemployment, payroll, and personal 7 tax obligations; and 8 WHEREAS, unlicensed contractors often operate without 9 10 regard to worker and workplace safety requirements; and 11 12 WHEREAS, violations of current licensing, employment, and tax laws by an unlicensed contractor may subject the unlicensed 13 contractor to civil and criminal penalties; and 14 15 WHEREAS, unlicensed contractors continue to engage in 16 illegal contracting despite prior judgments, consumer 17 restitution orders, and injunctions that prohibit continued 18 unlicensed activity; and 19 20 WHEREAS, criminal prosecutions and forfeiture actions are 21 underutilized as a means of enforcing laws against unlicensed 22 activity and deterring unlicensed activity; and 23 24 WHEREAS, unlicensed contractors place consumers at serious 25 risk of faulty construction and financial harm and adversely 26 impact the legitimate and licensed business operations within 27 the contracting industry; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Regulated Industries Complaints Office of the 30 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is charged with the 31 enforcement of the contractor licensing laws; and 32 33



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WHEREAS, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations 1 2 enforces the employment laws, including the workers' 3 compensation insurance laws, the unemployment insurance laws, 4 and workplace safety laws; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Department of Taxation enforces state tax 7 laws; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Department of the Attorney General is the 10 chief law enforcement agency of the State and, among other 11 things, enforces laws; and 12 WHEREAS, the Department or Office of the Prosecuting 13 Attorneys for each county is authorized to enforce the 14 respective county's laws; and 15 16 WHEREAS, effective and collaborative civil and criminal 17 18 enforcement of licensing, employment, and tax laws that may apply to unlicensed contractors promotes consumer protection and 19 20 a healthy state economy; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 23 of 2011, that the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is 24 25 requested to establish a task force consisting of representatives from the following state and county agencies: 26 27 (1)Regulated Industries Complaint Office of the 28 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs; 29 30 (2)Department of Labor and Industrial Relations; 31 32 (3) Department of Taxation; 33 34 (4) 35 Department of the Attorney General; and 36 37 (5) Department or Office of the Prosecuting Attorney of each of the counties; 38 39 40 to work collaboratively to more effectively enforce the State's civil and criminal laws that may apply to unlicensed 41 contractors; and 42 43



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1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is specifically
2	requested to:
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4	(1) Develop a cohesive and collaborative enforcement
5	strategy among the various civil, administrative, and
6 7	criminal enforcement agencies; and
8	(2) Evaluate existing laws and, where appropriate, propose
9	new laws or revisions to existing laws that would
10	facilitate more effective enforcement; and
11	
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Commerce and
13	Consumer Affairs is requested to report the task force's
14	findings and recommendations, together with any proposed
15	legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior
16	to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and
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18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
19	Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and
20	Consumer Affairs, Director of Labor and Industrial Relations,
21	Director of Taxation, the Attorney General, and the Prosecuting
22 23	Attorney of each respective county.
