## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM THE SECOND WEEK OF AUGUST AS "NATIONAL ASSISTANCE DOG WEEK".

1 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has 227,000 citizens with disabilities; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, those citizens, who need a service dog, wait 5 approximately 3 - 5 years for a service dog; and 6 7 WHEREAS, assistance dogs, which includes service dogs, guide dogs, hearing alert dogs and alert/seizure response dogs, 8 9 transform the lives of their human partners with physical and mental disabilities; and 10 11 WHEREAS, assistance dogs serve as devoted companions, 12 13 helpers, aides, best friends and close family members; and 14 15 WHEREAS, recognizing these dogs, who benefit Hawaii's 16 citizens with disabilities, will aid in raising awareness and educate the public about how these specially trained animals are 17 aiding so many people in Hawaii and could benefit so many more 18 19 of Hawaii's citizens; now, therefore, 20 IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 BE Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 of 2011, that the Governor is requested to express the State's 23 24 support for the contributions of service dogs to Hawaii's citizens with disabilities by proclaiming the second week of 25 26 August of every year, beginning on the second week of August 2011 as "Hawaii State Assistance Dogs Week" in the State of 27 28 Hawaii; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of Hawaii and the 31 32 Hawaii Humane Society.
