# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

URGING THE JUDICIARY TO EXPEDITE THE SELECTION OF THE SITE FOR  
THE KONA JUDICIARY COMPLEX AND CONSIDER LA'I'OPUA AS A  
POTENTIAL SITE FOR THE COMPLEX.

1           WHEREAS, the island of Hawai'i is the island with the second  
2 largest population in the State, and specifically the County of  
3 Hawai'i has had the highest population growth rate in the State  
4 in the past decade; and  
5

6           WHEREAS, according to the County of Hawai'i 2005 General  
7 Plan, the population of North and South Kona represents  
8 approximately 25 percent of the entire county population, which  
9 is projected to steadily increase through 2020 with a 52.5  
10 percent increase from the 2000 census; and

12           WHEREAS, court facilities in the West Hawai'i area of the  
13 County of Hawai'i, specifically the Kona region, are grossly  
14 inadequate to meet the current and future needs of the growing  
15 West Hawai'i population; and  
16

17           WHEREAS, major court operations are presently scattered  
18 throughout the Kona area at separate facilities, none of which  
19 were originally designed for use as a court, which has resulted  
20 in operational deficiencies, greater security risks, and public  
21 inconvenience; and  
22

23           WHEREAS, none of the West Hawai'i courtrooms meet the  
24 requirements of modern courtroom design; and

26           WHEREAS, the various buildings serving as court facilities  
27 in West Hawai'i lack appropriate or otherwise have inappropriate  
28 holding facilities for defendants making court appearances,  
29 resulting in overcrowded holding cells where defendants share  
30 common areas with court personnel and the general public; and

1           WHEREAS, court facilities in West Hawai'i also suffer from  
2 inadequate parking, storage space, rodent infestation, and  
3 compliance with Adults with Disabilities Act access  
4 requirements; and

6           WHEREAS, the Third Circuit Court lacks a juvenile detention  
7 center; and

8  
9           WHEREAS, the aforementioned circumstances necessitate  
10 immediate design and construction of a new court complex for the  
11 Kona area; and

13           WHEREAS, the Judiciary is currently engaged in the site  
14 selection process for the Kona Judiciary Complex, with the final  
15 decision to be made by the Chief Justice of the Hawai'i Supreme  
16 Court; now, therefore,

18           BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth  
19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the  
20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Judiciary is urged  
21 to expedite the selection of the site for the Kona Judiciary  
22 Complex; and

24           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Judiciary is urged to  
25 consider the site known as La'i'Opua, tax map key number 3-7-4-  
26 021:003, which is under the jurisdiction of the Department of  
27 Hawaiian Home Lands, as a potential site for the Kona Judiciary  
28 Complex; and

30           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Hawaiian Home  
31 Lands is urged to cooperate with the Judiciary for purposes of  
32 selecting a site for the Kona Judiciary Complex; and

34           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
35 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the

2 Commission.
